OVERVIEW

NAFTrack Certification is NAF's seal of college and career readiness — an employability credential that helps students and alumni stand out to future employers.

NAF uses a multi-method approach to assess a broad range of college and career readiness skills.

To achieve NAFTrack Certification, students must complete the following:

- Be enrolled in a NAF academy and career-connected program of study.
- Participate in 1 work-based learning activity from each phase of the WBL continuum: Career Awareness, Career Exploration, and Career Preparation.
- Demonstrate a level of mastery of the six Future Ready Skills, validated by an internship supervisor.

Career Preparation

Students reflect on their learning, set college and career goals, and take part in activities that showcase the culmination of their academy work-based learning experiences.

Activity Types

- Internships
- Clinical experiences
- Youth apprenticeships
- Mentored industry projects

Requirements

- 80+ hour experience (or two at 40+ hours)
- Work of value that provides relevant experience
- Experiences must demonstrate a student's mastery of skills, evaluated by a mentor or supervisor (not teacher, parent, or guardian) using the Future Ready Skills Assessment.
