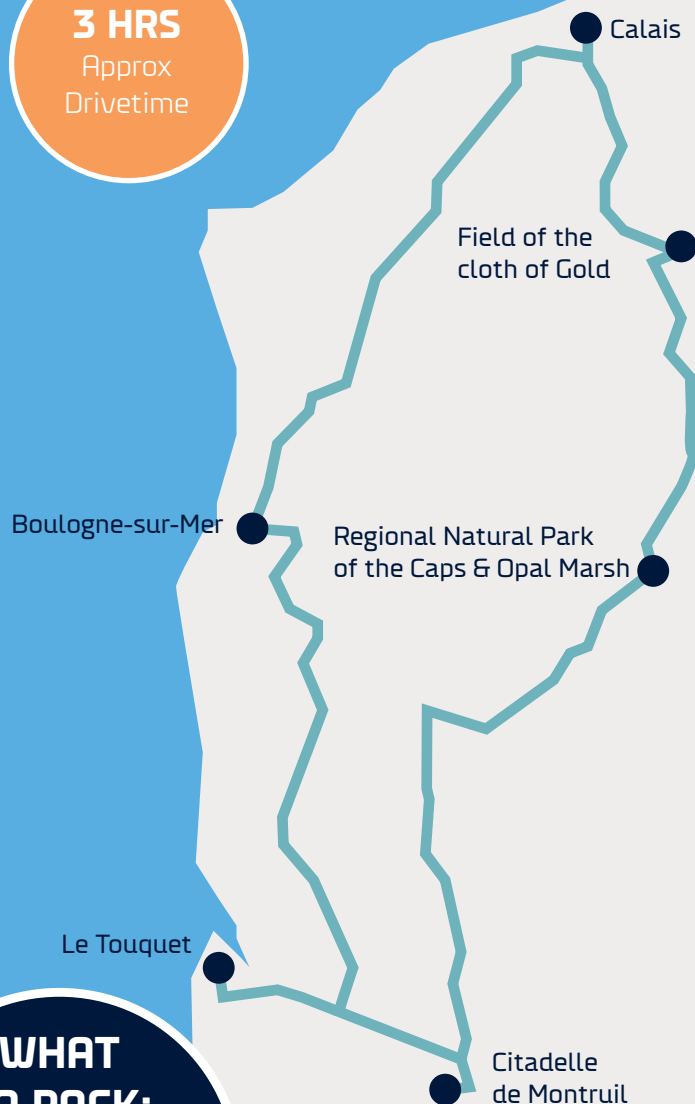
Calais • Park of the Caps & Opal Marsh • Le Touquet • Boulogne-sur-Mer

## WHERE TO GO:

- Take a unique tour of **Calais' seafront** on a 10m high fire-breathing dragon!
- While taking in the scenery of the Regional Natural Park of the Caps and Opal Marsh, stop by the **Field of the Cloth of Gold** which hosted a famous tournament between King Henry VIII of England and King Francis I of France
- Drive, walk or wander through the stunning countryside of the **Caps and Opal Marsh** – there are plenty of campsites here and great beauty spots to stop for a picnic
- Explore the **Citadelle de Montreuil**, a 15th century defensive castle, built by King Charles X
- Dip your toes in the sea, sample some fresh seafood and browse the art-deco style market at **Le Touquet**
- Spot thousands of sealife at Nausicaá, Europe's largest aquarium, climb the 12th century belfry and see Ancient Egyptian artefacts at the Castle Museum at **Boulogne-sur-Mer**
