

Roadtrip Netherlands to Germany

National Park De Hoge Veluwe - Cologne - Stops along The Moselle Valley -
The three-country point - Mergellandroute Zuid-Limburg

WHERE TO GO

- **Hoge Veluwe National Park** is one of the most popular attractions in the Netherlands. Occupying an area of 13,750 acres, this huge park is the largest continuous nature reserve in the country.
- Visit **Cologne** and head to Cologne Cathedral, which is recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Cologne also has many museums and art galleries and is of course known for its 4711 Eau de Cologne perfume.
- Continue your way through Germany to **The Moselle Valley** which has spectacular landscapes and romantic stops along the way. Stop by Cochem Castle, a UNESCO World Heritage site in Trier or indulge in some wine tasting in Bernkastel-Keus.
- On your way back to the Netherlands make a stop at **the three-country point**. It's the tripoint between Germany, Belgium and Netherlands.
- Popular with cyclists, the Mergellandroute in **Zuid-Limburg** will take you through the highlights of the breath-taking landscapes and picturesque villages in Zuid-Limburg.

- Check with restaurants, bars and cultural venues if you need to pre-book.
