

RAMS form for schools

- MOTAT is a significant organisation, comprising several buildings which meet the Auckland City Council requirements for safety and hygiene.
- As a public venue and a place of employment, MOTAT seeks and is fully compliant with Occupational Safety and Health regulations. Staff attend monthly Health and Safety meetings.
- Behaviour expectations are made explicit to school groups during their health and safety briefing.
- The MOTAT Tramway operates as a public transport service and as such is subject to stringent safety regulations.

• MOTAT staff have been trained in the event of an emergency.

People – skills, attitudes, age, ratios, experience	Children running on site	 Children walk around the exhibits and between locations Adult helpers actively supervise children around site
Equipment - transport, safety gear, education specific gear	Tram may have to brake suddenly for pedestrians	Children riding on tram to remain seated for the whole trip Handrails available in tram for adults who may need to stand

Environment	Vehicle movements around site	 During briefing, children and adult helpers are asked to be aware of transport movements around site Children walk around site Vehicles must have their hazard lights on, and are limited to 5km per hour
	Stairs around site	 Children walk up and down the stairs Everyone asked to hold on to the handrails
	Some activities may require water and result in a wet floor	Towels or a mop provided to clean up spills
	Objects used in sessions could be dropped/cause injury	 Children supervised at all times by adult helpers Children reminded to be careful when handling objects

Uneven surfaces and tram lines	Visitors asked to walk on site
Slippery surfaces which require care	 Slippery floor signs in place
Tram station near main road	Adult helpers to actively supervise children while waiting for the tram
