- . Step 1: First-time Scholars complete the "Agreement" section below. Returning Scholars complete the "Renewal" section below.
- Step 2: Once Step 1 is complete and approved by CCSF, you will receive an approval email with a link to the disbursement/deferral portal. No disbursement request will be approved before the
 agreement/renewal process is reviewed and approved.
 - Separate disbusement requests must be submitted for each term (i.e., one disbursement for fall 2021 and another for spring 2022; one for fall 2021, one for winter 2022, one for spring 2022)

AGREEMENT | For New 2021 Scholars

You've been named a Coca-Cola Scholar...now we need to make it official and ask you to formally and officially agree to the terms of your scholarship.

Even if you do not plan to use your scholarship award at all next year, all steps must be completed to fully accept the Coca-Cola Scholarship award. The Disbursement/Deferral Form tells us how you would like to use your scholarship funds.

You should submit this form if you want to request funds or defer your scholarship for any length of time during the upcoming academic year. A separate submission is required for EACH disbursement request. All requests must be submitted via this portal. Requests sent via email will not be processed. Deferral forms cover the entire academic year. If you submit a deferral request in the fall, you do not need to submit another deferral request in the spring.

Fall payments are generally mailed the second week of August, and Spring disbursements the second week in December. Although the portal allows for flexibility when selecting due dates, requests are processed in the order they are received and can take up to 10 business days to be processed and mailed from our office.


