	<b>Robust reporting:</b> Identify bias in who receives unrestricted funding (then work to redress it).
Do the homework	
	Internal forms: Supplement applications with publicly available information and more.
	Candid integration: Gather tax information automatically based on a nonprofit's EIN number.
Simplify and streamline paperwork	
	<b>Diverse file types:</b> Collect proposals written for other funders or in the formats the grantees' use themselves, as well as pave the way to verbal check ins.
	<b>Eligibility screening:</b> Ensure that only qualified candidates take the time to fill out your full form.
	Ease of use: Don't risk losing great applicants who are turned off by a clunky process.
	Mobile-friendly: Maintain a positive user experience for all applicants.
	<b>Editable:</b> Avoid any headache when applicants need to make changes or correct a mistake.
	Collaborative: Make it easier for remote teams to work on applications together.
	Auto-save: Help your applicants avoid the risk (and frustration) of losing their work.
Be transparent and responsive	
	<b>In-app communication:</b> Keep an open dialogue without having to dig through your inbox.
	Rich text guidelines: Transparently communicate your organization and program objectives.
	Rick-text instructions: Provide in-context examples and link to FAQs as needed.
	<b>Technical support for applicants:</b> Run a process accessible to users with all levels of technical comfort.
Solicit and act on feedback	
	Concealed responses: Encourage honest feedback through anonymous surveys.
