

APPENDIX 1: PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

1. Amendment to Definition of Immediate Past President; Insertion of Definitions of Immediate Vice President and Vice President

Background/Rationale

This amendment adjusts the definition of the Immediate Past President (**IPP**) to accord with the new mechanisms for replacing the IPP that are discussed below. Here it clarifies that if a former Executive is appointed to step into the IPP role, then references to the IPP in the Constitution will still apply to them. However, if a director is appointed from the closest USU election to fill the role (and will only be on Board for one year), they do not take on the "IPP" title or role, and are simply an extra, regular Director with a one year term to maintain the 11 voting elected roles.

The definition of Immediate Past Vice President (**IPVP**) is inserted to accord with the overall structural changes which implement the position. It is defined in the same way as the IPP, including with reference to the effect of replacements, with the only difference being it is (generally) filled by the preceding Vice President rather than the preceding President.

The definition of Vice President is included for completeness in the same way that the President is defined.

2. Amendment to Retain the 11 Voting Student Directors but Alter **Composition to Reflect Better Governance Practices for Continuity**

Background/Rationale

This amendment implements the governance changes necessary for the USU to have its incorporation approved by the University, with the exception of the changes to external Directors/Senate Appointed Directors. It also, importantly, aligns the USU's governance structures more closely with best practice; the inclusion of the IPP and IPVP brings additional continuity and institutional knowledge to the Board without having to concede a reduction in elected student voices. The number of elected students will, overall, remain at 11. This is a major coup for the USU and its members, meaning that we can gain the governance benefits without diluting the student voice.

These changes make amendments from 1 July 2025.

The amendments also provide for a mechanism to replace an unwilling or unavailable IPP and/or IPVP if that situation arose. The first is the mechanism currently in place for the IPP, where another member of the immediate past Executive can fill the role. The backup is that the spot on Board will not be left vacant, but filled by an additional first year Director who will serve a one year term to ensure the student voice isn't diluted in this unlikely scenario.

- (b) If the Immediate Past President or the Immediate Past Vice President, or both, is unable or unwilling to become a Director, the Board may, at its discretion, appoint a person who was a member of the immediate past Executive, and who is not currently a Director, as an alternative Director. The alternative Director shall then serve:
 - (i) for the balance of the Immediate Past President or Immediate Past Vice President's term; or
 - (ii) until such time as the Immediate Past President or Immediate Past Vice President notifies the USU that they are able to accept or resume their appointment under article 7.3(a)(iii).
- (ba) If one or both of the positions of Immediate Past President and Immediate Past Vice President cannot be filled pursuant to art 7.3(b), then the position shall be filled by the highest polling candidate(s) at the USU Board election of that year. For the avoidance of doubt, these Directors will serve a one year term for the period that the Director role would otherwise have been filled by the Immediate Past President or Immediate Past Vice President, but will not take on the title itself.
- (ab) Changes made to the composition of the Board at the April 2025 General Meeting will not come into effect until 1 July 2025, except insofar as the Special Meeting of the Incoming Board in 2025 will be conducted in accordance with the relevant amendments.

7.4 Voting at Board meetings

- (a) All Directors may vote at Board Meetings except as otherwise provided by this Constitution explicitly or by implication.
- (b) The following persons may participate in, attend, and speak at meetings of the Board, but do not have any right to vote:
 - (i) the CEO and other Officers of the USU who are not otherwise Directors.; and
 - (ii) the Immediate Past President



3. Adjusting and Confirming the Validity of the 2025 USU Election to Reflect Improved Governance Structure

Background/Rationale

This insertion is solely for an overabundance of caution. It confirms that the 2025 election will continue to be valid and that those who have nominated will still be able to run for the Board as intended with no unforeseen issues.

Summary of the proposed change

4. Adjusting the 2025 Special Meeting of the Incoming Board to Reflect **Improved Governance Structure and Retain Student Voice**

Background/Rationale

This clause is a transitional clause which clarifies that whilst the overall structural changes won't come into effect until 1 July 2025, the Special Meeting of the Incoming Board will be conducted as usual but accounting for the amendments made at this Special General Meeting.

Said elections are to be conducted by secret ballot and by a quota preferential method of representation in accordance with the rules published by the Proportional Representation Society of Australia, or its successor body. (ba) The Incoming Board has no power prior to 1 July other than to conduct the business of the Special Meeting of the Incoming Board. (bb) For the avoidance of doubt, at the Special Meeting of the Incoming Board that is conducted in 2025, the voting members will include the five Directors elected in 2024, the four Directors elected in 2025, the Immediate Past President that will serve in the role in 2025/26, and the two Senate Appointed Directors.



5. Clarifying Minor Amendment to Office Term

Background/Rationale

This clause clarifies that the term of office for a Director will generally be two years, but in the case of the IPP/IPVP it shall be three (and any replacement of those positions will be for one).
