





PORTA NUOVA: FIRST LOT OF THE 'BIBLIOTECA DEGLI ALBERI' PARK NOW OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AND CONSTRUCTION WORK ON THE SECOND LOT GETS UNDER WAY

- The first lot will open to citizens with a Spring Festival on 1st April
- The second lot of the Biblioteca degli Alberi park, designed by the Inside Outside Petra Blaisse studio, will be completed by the summer of 2018
- Citizens will be able to take part in the park's construction through the *MiColtivo nel Parco* project promoted by the Fondazione Riccardo Catella

Milan, 29 March 2017 - The first lot of the "Biblioteca degli Alberi" park in Porta Nuova is officially open: the first 7,500 m2 at Via de Castillia 26/28 will be open to the public as from tomorrow 30 March and mid-April will see a start to work on the second lot of the park (adding approximately 77,000 m2). Citizens will be able to take part in the park's construction through the *MiColtivo nel Parco* project promoted by Fondazione Riccardo Catella.

The first lot is scheduled to be officially opened on **Saturday**, **1st April:** a **Spring Festival** with creative and teaching laboratories for children, bowls tournaments and breakfast for everyone. The park area at Via de Castillia 26/28, around the Fondazione Riccardo Catella and the Art Incubator, hosts 44 trees from three different species (*Frassinus Excelsior, Populus Nigra Italica* and *Carpinus Betulus*), two bowls fields, water games and an innovative play-park that is also accessible to disabled children. LAND studio directed the works for the first lot of Milan City Council's project including a didactic vegetable garden (approximately 260 m2), which will host a new **urban horticultural laboratories program** open to citizens once a week. This program will be **managed by Fondazione Riccardo Catella**, which has been operating in the enhancing of public spaces and local sustainable development for more than ten years.

The award of the international tenders for Works Management encompasses a mid-April 2017 start of the site for the second lot. During the construction phase, the area will welcome the *MiColtivo nel Parco* range of initiatives promoted by **Fondazione Riccardo Catella as part of the Porta Nuova Smart Community program**. *MiColtivo nel Parco* seeks to draw attention to the importance of optimising urban green areas through the *direct involvement of citizens in the park's realisation*: guided tours of the site, special events for the collective planting of flowered lawns, flowerbeds and trees and urban horticultural laboratories.

The Main Partners of *of MiColtivo nel Parco* are **COIMA** and **BNP Paribas Italia**, which has recently opened the new "Diamond Tower" office in Porta Nuova. The Group - also thanks to the dedication and sensitivity of the nearly 3,400 employees that work and live in Milan, is backing the project, confirming its reputation as a responsible company that cares for society, people, and the environment.

Once completed, the 'Biblioteca degli Alberi' will be **Milan centre's third largest public park**, stretching out over **9.5 hectares**. The definitive project for the park - for which the municipal administration called an "International design contest" in 2004, awarded to the studio Inside Outside|Petra Blaisse, based in Amsterdam, in partnership with Studio Giorgetta in Milan - was approved in December 2014. In June 2015, **COIMA SGR** was appointed by the municipal authorities to carry out the works on the public park, and in accordance with Italian regulations will deduct the relative costs from the fees for the large urban planning project.







The project was assigned to **IN.G.RE Scrl**, the consortium company involving the implementers of PII Garibaldi Repubblica (the area development plan) and which was created specifically in order to develop public works and carry out the environmental requalification aspects of the Plan. The executive project was completed and approved mid-March 2016 by the municipal administration, which then supported it across all stages of the urban planning process through the Urban Planning, Green Areas and Agriculture Department of the City Council.

The Biblioteca degli Alberi will also be Porta Nuova's "green lung", a new public space and central element throughout the development of the area, divided up into three main areas: the largest, between Melchiorre Gioia, Via Pirelli and Via de Castillia; the second covering the underground car park in Piazza Luigi Einaudi; and the third along the straight band running along Viale della Liberazione and through to Piazza San Gioachimo and its churchyard. Paths and connections form the real basis for the park project, the first in Milan to be designed according to a contemporary concept. There are three key elements: the linear paths that bring the external and internal areas together; the irregular fields, which draw out gardens, lawns, flowerbeds and small yards; and the circular forests, groups of trees creating real "green rooms" in which to relax. The park will feature approximately 450 trees of 19 different species, 34,800 m2 of lawns and nearly 90,000 plants, including hedges, shrubs, climbing plants, and aquatic and ornamental plants in the gardens designed by Petra Blaisse and Piet Oudolf.

The Biblioteca degli Alberi park, acting as a sort of connecting loop between public spaces, infrastructures and the vertical and horizontal architectures of the surrounding districts, connects Piazza Gae Aulenti to the Isola district, the raised area over Via Melchiorre Gioia, the green promenade of Varesine and the garden of Via de Castillia, thereby creating **the city's largest pedestrian area with 170,000 m2 and 5 km of cycle tracks to serve the over 10 million people** that visited the Porta Nuova area in 2016 alone.

The park's development will mark completion of **Porta Nuova** - one of the largest urban and architectonic requalification projects in Europe, developed and managed by COIMA - which can now boast the greatest concentration in Italy for LEED GOLD certified buildings (22) and numerous international awards: Unicredit Tower (Cesar PelliPCPA) nominated as amongst the world's 10 most beautiful towers (Emporis Skyscraper Award 2012); Bosco Verticale (Boeri Studio) winner of the International Highrise Award 2014 and of the Council on Tall Buildings and Urban Habitat 2015; Piazza Gae Aulenti winner of the Landscape Institute Award 2016.

Marta Spaini, lawyer from the law firm Leone - Torrani e Associati, assisted COIMA with the administrative-legal procedures connected with the park project development.

Founded by Franco Giorgetta, it started operations in 1965 with the project of the Italian participation in the Ghent Floralies. Over the years, it has worked on research activities, publications, exhibitions, and teaching activities. Franco Giorgetta's daughter, Simona, an architect, joined the studio in 2005. The urban planner Davide Telesca and the architects Gloria Montini and Grazia Comai also work at the studio.
