Under the terms of the <u>Scheme of MPs' Business Costs and Expenses</u> ('the Scheme'), MPs can claim the costs of payments for pooled staffing services, which provide research, briefing and drafting services to groups of MPs on parliamentary-related matters. There are currently five such services which are registered with IPSA: the Parliamentary Research Service (for Labour MPs); the Policy Research Unit (for Conservative MPs); the Scottish National Party Research Team (for SNP MPs); the Parliamentary Support Team (for Liberal Democrat MPs) and the European Research Group, which provides briefings to Conservative MPs on issues relating to the UK's relationship with the European Union.

Pooled services are widely used by MPs, and can provide significant economies of scale. Research is completed by small teams of researchers at pooled service organisations, and made available to all subscribing MPs. This enables MPs to deploy more of their staffing resources in other areas of work. MPs and their staff are provided with a number of services, including:

- detailed background research and briefings on political, economic, and governmental affairs;
- template correspondence that can be used by MPs to respond to constituents who have contacted their MP with the same or similar queries;
- materials (such as suggested parliamentary questions) for use in debates in the House of Commons or in Westminster Hall; and
- information on the passage of legislation through parliament.

The work conducted by these groups must be *parliamentary* in nature in order to qualify for reimbursement.

I am extremely concerned that it seems that a closed group of MPs are using Taxpayers money, drawn via the MPs expensese system to fund an internal research organisation. This appears to be an entirely self serving organisation where the following MPs, doubtless there are others:

Since this is clearly, not a mere subscription to the Economist, it would appear that these MPs are using public funds to support their own pet interests. If the work requested and paid for as a subscription by these MPs is to be funded by the Taxpayer then why is it that the data is not in the public domain.

This particular group do not appear to have any wider accreditation so this looks like a "con" or "scam" to allow MPs to get the taxpayer to fund an organisation that serves their particular aims.

As such this means these MPs are stealing from the public purse and misrepresenting expenses. Presumably MPs cannot claim memberships of "Whites" as genuine expesses that the taxpayer is expected to pay for therefore we should not be paying for the ERG.

Thank you to look into this matter and likewise advise the MPs involved or what appears to be misuse of public funds.

We received a similar request in October 2017 for 'all examples of research done for the European Research Group held by IPSA'. In our response, which can be viewed here, this information was withheld from disclosure under section 43 of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). This exemption relates to information which, if disclosed, would be likely to prejudice the commercial interests of any person.

Materials are produced by the ERG for paying subscribers, and the commercial viability of the organisation relies upon these paid subscriptions. Disclosure of this material would directly prejudice the commercial interests of the ERG (as the content can only otherwise be obtained via a paid subscription), and as such the information is exempt from disclosure under the terms of the FOIA.

Sir,

I would be grateful if you could assist.

I am member of a Group with Brexit concerns. We contact figures/organisations and seek Brexit information and clarifications, and make our views known.

We wish to contact the *European Research Group* [ERG]. I understand ERG provide briefings to Conservative MPs on issues of UK-EU relationships, and is one of five groups which provide MPs such services so registered with the IPSA. However, while aware the Rt Hon Jacob Reese-Mogg MP is ERG Chairman, I can find no ERG contact address. I happily accept the fault is mine. But that does not help.

I am aware the IPSA addressed queries regarding ERG funding. It may be that due to this, and as ERG is IPSA registered, you have an ERG contact email address.

Of course it may be you directly contact the staff of the individual ERG MPs, can release no, or have no, or there is no, such contact address. If you have one I would be grateful if you could foreward it to me. If for any reason you cannot do so, please inform me as there rermains the option of a solution from Mr. Reese-Mogg.

Thank you for your call just now.

I've just spoken with my colleague who handles all the pooled services stuff.

In terms of claims for pooled staffing services, including the ERG, our Scheme says: "Where IPSA has an agreed arrangement in place, it can pay annual subscriptions for pooled staffing services direct to the relevant organisations who provide such services. These organisations send direct payment request forms to their users annually." In short, any MP who wants to subscribe to one of the pooled services signs up directly with the pooled service (usually at the beginning of the financial year). They usually sign a form confirming that they wish to subscribe, and that they are happy for the subscription fees to be deducted from their staffing or office costs budget. The pooled services in turn then provide us with the names of all the subscribing MPs and copies of the signed forms so that we can allocate the costs to their individual budgets. We then publish this as a claim on our website.

So in terms of what we hold relating to each claim, we hold a signed form for each subscribing MP. I've attached a blank copy of what that form looks like (from a couple of years ago) – you're very welcome to request all the completed forms if you'd like, but the only additional thing they'd tell you is the names of the MPs, which we publish anyway. There's also an invoice from the ERG itself (which accompanies the signed forms).

In terms of the number of MPs who claim the fees to receive the research briefings, page 13 of our assurance report shows the annual totals. Our published data shows 25 MPs subscribed in 2016-17 and 18 MPs in 2017-18.

Also – in case of interest – we responded to another FOI last week in which we disclosed some correspondence that we have exchanged with the ERG. I've attached our written response and the correspondence in question.


