Itinerary 2

Sail from Miami to Key West and to tropical paradises in the Caribbean and Central America. Visit remote islands and protected marine areas with sandy beaches, crystal-clear waters, diverse wildlife, and fascinating history.

Day 1 Miami

Start your expedition cruise in Miami's vibrant cocktail of Latin American, Caribbean, African, and European cultures. Consider arriving early for an optional Pre-Program to see more of what Miami offers.

Day 2 Key West (Full day) Wander about laid-back Key West, the southernmost island in the Florida Keys and just 90 miles from Cuba, and don't forget to visit the Ernest Hemingway House Museum. INCLUBED EXCURSION: Old Trolley Tour

Days 3-4 At Sea

Join the Expedition Team as they prepare you for your upcoming tropical island experiences. Spend time on deck, watch for marine wildlife, or participate in an invigorating yoga workshop.

Day 5 Belize City (Full day) Discover colonial houses and seaside parks, and cross the Belize City Swing Bridge. Take a tour to the Mayan Lamanai temple in the surrounding jungle, and keep an eye out for crocodiles, bats, and monkeys.

Day 6 Lighthouse Reef (Full day) Land at remote Half Moon Cay on Lighthouse Reef to visit Belize's oldest bird sanctuary and first protected marine area, home to endangered loggerhead, hawksbill, and green sea turtles. Day 7 Isla de Útila (Full day) Explore the tiny tropical island of Útila, which at eight-miles long and three-miles wide forms part of the world's second-largest barrier reef system and is home to gentle whale sharks up to 20-feet long. INCLUDED EXCURSION: Water Cay Beach

Day 8 Cayos Cochinos

(Full day) Discover this strictly protected archipelago with no roads, cars, or motorbikes. Explore crystal-clear waters and observe marine wildlife at what is quite possibly the most beautiful place in Honduras.

Day 9 Trujillo (Full day) Visit three indigenous Garífuna fishing villages, meet local people, and try gifiti, a traditional drink. Learn about the area's history—from Christopher Columbus to pirates to banana companies.

Day 10 At Sea

Enjoy another relaxing day at sea. Join the Expedition Team for interesting lectures, learn the basics of expedition photography, watch for wildlife, or unwind with a yoga and meditation workshop out on deck.

Day 11 Isla de Providencia

(Full day) Visit this tiny, unspoiled Colombian island in the Spanish Caribbean, discover deserted



golden beaches, and explore coral reefs in the UNESCO World Heritage Site-listed Seaflower Biosphere Reserve. INCLUDED EXCURSION: Cultural Show

Day 12 Corn Islands (Full day) Hike up Mount Pleasant Hill for sweeping views of sandy bays and coves, or snorkel about pristine coral reefs with barracudas, hammerhead sharks, green sea turtles, and spotted rays.

Day 13 Bocas del Toro (Full day) Experience amazing Bocas del Toro, considered one of the most biologically diverse places on Earth, with deserted sandy beaches, teeming coral reefs, and lush rainforests. INCLUDED EXCURSION: Water Taxi to Local Beach with Nature Trail Walk

Day 14 At Sea

Drop by the Science Center and use its state-of-the-art microscopes to observe samples taken during the cruise, attend another interesting Expedition Team lecture, and do yoga and meditate under the stars.

Day 15 San Blas Islands

(Full day) Step into this natural paradise inhabited by the Guna Yala people, who protect their pristine islands by only conducting and accepting eco-friendly tourism. Day 16 Colón End your cruise through the Caribbean at the entrance to the Panama Canal. We highly recommend adding a few extra nights with an optional Post-Program to explore even more of the region.
