

Penn State & RaiseMe Snippets for Student/Parent Communication

About the Snippets:

- Most are short 1-3 sentences, prewritten for NON-follower students, and adaptable to other audiences including follower students and parents/supporters.
- Unique snippets for 12th grade intended to be more action-driven with heightened attention to deadlines
- A long-form announcement is provided for each of the 9-11th and 12th grades.
- All include similar calls to action
- Each one is flexible enough to modify and cut/copy/paste excerpts of different snippets to create your own, appropriately tailored per platform or individual student/parent
- Each snippet can be used as standalone messaging, or added to other messaging as calls to action, reminders, PS (postscripts), sidenotes, special highlights, etc. for the respective audience with whom you're communicating
- Examples of various types of communications where snippets can be used:
 - o School newsletter
 - School/course (LMS) portals
 - Financial aid event flyer
 - o Mass email about preparing for college
 - Student/parent email about applying to Penn State.

12th grade (or academic Senior year equivalent)
