Notes

It is an offence under section 230(1) of the Fisheries Act 1996 to make any false or misleading statement in this application. If you are convicted of an offence against that section, you are liable to a fine not exceeding \$250,000.

You may only apply for a international fishing permit in respect of a vessel if you are identified in the Fishing Vessel Register as the operator of that vessel.

The vessel to which your permit application relates must be registered under the Ship Registration Act 1992 and in the Fishing Vessel Register. The vessel must also have an IMO Number.

If any of the details in this application form change, you are required to notify Fishserve immediately.

Incomplete applications will be returned to you and may result in a delay with the processing of your application.

If you plan to fish for a species managed under an international, regional or sub-regional organisation or arrangement, or national jurisdiction of a foreign country, then you may require an additional fishing permit, authorisation or approval from the Ministry for Primary Industries.

All vessels fishing under the authority of an international fishing permit are required to carry and continuously operate a Geospatial Position Reporting Device (GPR) registered with Fishserve during the term of the international fishing permit.

Photo Requirements

There is a requirement for all applicants to provide photographs of sufficiently high resolution, colour, brightness, and contrast so as to properly identify the vessel and all relevant details, irrespective of the Regional Fisheries Management Organisation (RFMO) or national fisheries jurisdiction.

The photographs must be less than 5 years old, and shall consist of:

- One photograph showing the starboard side of the vessel, displaying its full overall length and complete structural features and the correct vessel markings;
- One photograph showing the port side of the vessel, displaying its full overall length and complete structural features and the correct vessel markings; and
- · One photograph showing the stern of the vessel, taken directly from astern.

For vessels that have not previously been authorised to fish in the SPRFMO Convention Area, or that are not currently in the SPRFMO Record of Vessels, photographs must be date-stamped to confirm they are less than 5 years old.

Privacy Act 2020 – Collection of Personal Information

Your personal information is being collected to enable your application for an international fishing permit to be processed, and for purposes relating to the management and conservation of fisheries and fisheries resources in the national jurisdictions of other states and on the high seas.

The agency collecting and holding this information is Commercial Fisheries Services Limited (Fishserve), PO Box 297, Wellington, 6140.

The collection of this information is required under section 113G of the Fisheries Act 1996. It is not mandatory that you supply this information, but your application may not be processed if you do not provide all the information requested on this form.

You have the right to access and correct your personal information.

You may apply to Fishserve to prevent the display of your personal address on registers kept under the Fisheries Act 1996 if you consider that disclosure would be prejudicial to your personal safety or to the safety of your family.

Niue Treaty Subsidiary Agreement (NTSA)

Your personal information may be disclosed under the terms of the NTSA, including to other countries that are a party to the NTSA, if required. Any such disclosure would be on a case-by-case basis and consistent with the Privacy Act 2020. However, foreign persons or entities may not be required to protect the information in a way that, overall, provides comparable safeguards to those in the Privacy Act 2020.
