Notes

If the operator of the vessel ceases to hold a New Zealand High Seas Fishing Permit, they must immediately notify the Ministry for Primary Industries (email: FisheriesRegistryServices@mpi.govt.nz).

If any of the details relating to the registration of this vessel change, the operator must immediately notify the Ministry for Primary Industries (email: FisheriesRegistryServices@mpi.govt.nz).

Bottom fishing includes bottom trawling, mid-water trawling and bottom long-lining (including drop lining, dahn lining, trot lining and hand lining).

Permit holders must notify MPI Fisheries Communication Centre (FCC) and MPI Observer Services <u>five (5) working days</u> prior to a vessel's departure from port for the high seas, as required by the conditions of the high seas fishing permit.

Permit holders must also notify the SPRFMO Secretariat <u>72 hours</u> prior to a vessel entering the SPRFMO Convention Area, and immediately upon a vessel exiting the SPRFMO Convention Area, as required by the conditions of the SPRFMO schedule attached to the high seas fishing permit.

Privacy Act 2020 - Collection of Personal Information

Your personal information is being collected to enable your application for a high seas fishing permit to be processed, and for purposes relating to the management and conservation of fisheries and fisheries resources in the SPRFMO Convention Area.

The agency collecting and holding this information is Commercial Fisheries Services Limited (FishServe), PO Box 297, Wellington, 6140.

It is not mandatory that you supply this information, but your application may not be processed if you do not provide all the information requested on this form.

You have the right to access and correct your personal information.

You may apply to FishServe to prevent the display of your personal address on registers kept under the Fisheries Act 1996 if you consider that disclosure would be prejudicial to your personal safety or to the safety of your family.

Niue Treaty Subsidiary Agreement (NTSA)

Your personal information may be disclosed under the terms of the NTSA, including to other countries that are a party to the NTSA, if required. Any such disclosure would be on a case-by-case basis and consistent with the Privacy Act 2020. However, foreign persons or entities may not be required to protect the information in a way that, overall, provides comparable safeguards to those in the Privacy Act 2020. By submitting this application you authorise disclosure of your personal information outside New Zealand under the terms of the NTSA.
