Together we are committed to supporting young people in their education and delivering positive social impacts for our local communities. Together we've already achieved great things!

This last year, ESR's dedicated team helped make over 8000 sandwiches (and counting!) that Eat Up delivers to the <u>1 in 5</u> Aussie kids experiencing food insecurity.

ESR made an additional donation of \$10,000, on behalf of customers in 2023 which will help provide 15 schools with free lunches for 12 months (17,000 lunches).

Our National Partnership will continue through 2024, with staff volunteer sessions in Melbourne, Sydney and Brisbane.







Meeting the need

New schools are identified using socioeconomic data, Index of Community Socio-Educational Advantage scores and other sources. Once schools are enrolled, Eat Up is in constant contact with them to ensure that deliveries are meeting their needs.

Now supporting 758 schools, nationally.

Materials Sourced

Eat Up sources the items needed to make and deliver sandwiches - where possible at low or no cost.

People Power

Eat Up engages with schools, communities and workplaces to make 20,000 sandwiches each week. This year we have joined forces with 9275+ volunteers across the country to make sure we meet the ever growing need for lunches. This volunteer/partnership model helps ensure Eat Up is cost-effective and sustainable, while also raising awareness of the important social issue of food insecurity.

Lunches delivered

Sandwiches are delivered to schools together with recess and fruit items, where available. Lunches are discreetly distributed by teachers to children in need. They are free of branding to avoid embarrassment.
