BCS comments - EIS - Horsley Logistics Park Stage 2 (SSD-71144719) Biodiversity

BCS issued its BDAR waiver determination to the Department for this subject SSD application on 20 August 2024.

As stated in BCS's determination, *Proposed development means the development as described in DOC24/419972 and Schedule 1. If the proposed development changes so that it is no longer consistent with this description, a further waiver request is required.*

Based on the information provided in the EIS, it appears that the proposed development is not consistent with the description in BCS's determination. A new BDAR waiver will need to be submitted prior to the determination of the application

Flood Risk Management

The completed flood studies indicate that the site is not subject to flooding and not expected to be flood affected under the PMF Event. The site would not have secondary flood impacts nor evacuation constraints during major flooding events including the PMF Event. On that basis BCS does not have any flood related comments to make.
