Efforts to increase access to energy-efficient and healthy affordable homes will be more effective when people from multiple fields, sectors, and disciplines come together in a strategic and coordinated way. The resources needed are too great and the solutions are too interdependent for one individual, organization, or sector to solve the complex challenges that inhibit access to affordable and healthy homes.

EEFA uses the tools of coalition and network building to bring together individuals and organizations with diverse perspectives and expertise to reach common goals. Specifically, Energy Efficiency for All leaders work with partners to build and sustain 12 state coalitions of equity, health, housing, environmental, anti-poverty, and community-based organizations. State partners pool their resources and expertise to achieve greater reach, credibility, and advocacy power than any individual organization acting alone. EEFA supports these coalitions by providing coaching, training, and funding; coordinating coalition activities; conducting research; and providing coalition-building and technical expertise.



EEFA's "Cooking Up" Coalitions: Introduction to Coalition Building is a guide to successful coalition building practices, inspired by the experience of and meant to sustain the work of Energy Efficiency for All.

EEFA has also created the national Network for Energy, Water and Health in Affordable Buildings, or NEWHAB, as a platform for coalition members and diverse sector leaders to convene, learn from one another and develop collective solutions. NEWHAB is a national social impact network leveraging the relationships between individuals, sectors,

and policies. It connects multiple sectors including energy, affordable housing, water, health, and social justice and is focused on addressing complex challenges. NEWHAB's membership totals more than 100 individuals, with an additional 200 allies who work towards a shared purpose.

Energy Efficiency for All (EEFA) unites people from diverse sectors and backgrounds, including housing, energy efficiency, environmental, health, and community leaders, to collectively make multifamily homes healthy and affordable through energy and water efficiency.
