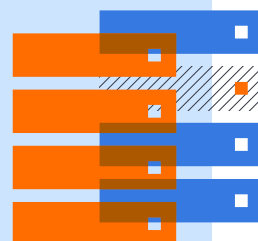

Always remember to cite the funding organisation in your research work.
e.g. National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC)



TIP 2

Always select the right journal to publish your research. Use journal metrics to determine the right journal for your research. Journal Metrics are an important consideration for research impact.

Note the metrics: CiteScore, Citations, Documents, % Cites, SNIP and SJR
 $SNIP \& SJR = 1$

A score of 1 or above indicates that this journal meets the global average in terms of Source Normalised Impact (SNIP) and Reputation (SJR).
