A real gateway to Southern Europe, halfway between Provence and Catalonia, Montpellier enjoys a strategic position in the heart of the Mediterranean arc. Its TGV train stations in the city centre "Saint-Roch" and near the airport "Sud de France" (Paris-Montpellier: 3h15), its international airport Montpellier Méditerranée (10 mn from the city centre), its motorway accesses (A9/A709 to Lyon, Marseille, Toulouse, Spain and Italy, and A75 to Paris) and its exceptional public transport network will make it easy for you to access.

Access by plane

Montpellier Méditerranée airport is only 8 km from the city centre. There are flights to 27 international destinations and 6 destinations in France and in particular:

- 1h10 from Paris
- 1h45 from London
- 1h55 from Amsterdam

13 airlines operate direct flights. It is also easily accessible from the airports of Marseille, Lyon, Toulouse, Beziers and Carcassonne.







Airport Shuttle

The shuttle bus connects the city centre of Montpellier to the airport in 15 minutes.

Montpellier Méditerranée Airport is located 10 minutes from the city centre and the beaches, at the gateway to the motorway network.

The Saint-Roch station is connected by the four tramway lines as well as buses 6, 7, 8, 11, 12, 16 and is located in the heart of the city, 200 metres from the Place de la Comédie.

The second station in the heart of the future Cambacérès district. It is served by two bus lines (120 & 106) and a shuttle, provided by the TAM, which Montpellier Sud de France at the Place de France stop, where you can take the tramway line 1 and the bus line 9.

The aim of this station is to save time on journeys to and from Spain and Belgium, but also Paris and Lyon. The new TGV station is the pillar of this new multimodal hub, located in the heart of the future Cambacérès district ("innovation" area where companies/start-ups, higher education establishments, housing and natural spaces will be located).

17 trains Paris-Montpellier and 18 trains Montpellier-Paris, every day!

Train Station Shuttle

The shuttle bus connects the shopping centre Odysseum of Montpellier to the train station Sud de France in 5 minutes.



Public and ecological transport in Montpellier

Montpellier: One of the largest pedestrian area and the largest tramway network in France!

Montpellier's tramway is the ideal way to get around Montpellier and discover the city from a different angle, on foot or by bike. After being judged the "sexiest tramway in Europe" in 2012 by the New York Times, the Montpellier tramway was voted the most beautiful in France among the twelve major French transport networks according to a survey by the daily newspaper 20 minutes.

Montpellier mobility, an ecological transition

For better air quality and a quieter living environment, an ambitious concept of active mobility has been launched by 2025: free local public transport, support for the purchase of electric bikes and an extended network of cycle paths.

Montpellier currently has 4 tram lines, 36 bus lines, more than 50 self-service bicycle stations and 160 km of bicycle lanes. By 2025, the construction of a fifth tramway line, the extension of line 1 to the Sud de France station and the addition of 5 more trambus lines will strengthen the city's transport network.

To complete the existing network, Montpellier Méditerranée Métropole plans to create a bicycle express network called "Vélolignes Montpellier" by 2026. It will link several municipalities in the Metropole and will include a network of advanced services of about 230 km.

Montpellier Méditerranée offers many advantages for cycling. In the heart of the vineyards and garrigues, by the sea or in the Petite Camargue, cycle tourism is well established in our region.





Private transports

The city of Montpellier is served by the A9/A709 and A75 motorways.

- North exit (28): access to the Zoo du Lunaret and its Amazonian Greenhouse, hospitals and universities.
- East exit (29): access to the historical centre, the Tourist Office of Montpellier Méditerranée Métropole, the congress centre (Corum), the new districts, the Sud de France train station, the Zénith Sud auditorium, the Odysseum shopping centre and the Sud de France Arena.
- Exit West (30): access to the Yves le Manoir stadium and La Mosson stadium.
- South exit (31): access to Montpellier Saint-Roch train station.
