Myth: It won't happen to me

Fact: 1 in 174 Australian households fall victim to motor vehicle theft each year

What can you do? Its easy!

LOCK all doors and windows and ensure everyone in your home is doing the same.

STOP sneak theft.

Fact: On average, victims of car theft incur \$5,000 in out of pocket expenses even if insured

Myth: Thieves will come looking for my keys if I don't leave them in an obvious spot.

Fact: Most car thieves actively avoid confrontation with homeowners. If a thief is unable to easily find the keys, they will simply move on.
