

POP. LOCK. STOP Social Media Kits

This kit is designed to assist you in utilising the NMVTRC's social media resources as part of the Pop. Lock. Stop. Campaign. The following are provided as examples of posts for Twitter, Facebook and Instagram. We encourage you to also come up with your own ideas for posts that are best suited to your LGA. However, social media posts should aim to promote the 'key' messages of the campaign, including-

- 7 in 10 cars are stolen with their own keys;
- Offenders sneak into homes through unlocked doors and windows. It's called sneak theft. (You can stop it.);
- Car theft is preventable and there are simple steps you can take to reduce your risk;
- It's easy. Pop. Lock. Stop sneak theft; and
- Sneak thieves actively avoid confrontation with home owners.

Example 1:

Example 1:

Did you know that 7 in 10 cars are stolen with their own keys? Offenders sneak into homes through unlocked doors and windows to access keys. It's called Sneak Theft. There are some simple steps you can take to stop them—

POP keys out of sight.

LOCK all doors and windows and ensure everyone in the home is doing the same.

STOP sneak theft.

Example 2:

Having a car stolen is stressful, inconvenient, and costly. Offenders often sneak into homes through unlocked doors and windows to access car keys. Follow some simple steps to safeguard your keys—

POP keys out of sight.

LOCK all doors and windows and ensure everyone in your home is doing the same.

STOP sneak theft.

Myth: Thieves are only interested in stealing luxury cars

Fact: Modern, mainstream cars are commonly the most stolen vehicles

What can you do to secure your car?

POP keys out of sight.

LOCK all doors and windows and ensure everyone in your home is doing the same.

STOP sneak theft.

Myth: My vehicle is safe when at home

Fact: Thieves are stealing cars by sneaking into homes and taking the car keys.

What can you do to secure your car?

POP keys out of sight.

LOCK all doors and windows and ensure everyone in your home is doing the same.

STOP sneak theft.

Myth: My car is secured with an immobiliser, so it will be safe.

Fact: Whilst immobilisers prevent hot-wiring, thieves are now getting hold of the car keys in order to steal a car

What can you do?

POP keys out of sight.

LOCK all doors and windows and ensure everyone in your home is doing the same.

STOP sneak theft.

Myth: It won't happen to me

Fact: 1 in 174 Australian households fall victim to motor vehicle theft each year

What can you do? Its easy!

POP keys out of sight.

LOCK all doors and windows and ensure everyone in your home is doing the same.

STOP sneak theft.

Myth: Vehicle theft isn't as important as other 'serious' crimes

Fact: Vehicles are stolen to facilitate other crimes such as armed robberies, burglaries or to trade for drugs

Myth: I am insured so it doesn't matter if my car gets stolen

Fact: On average, victims of car theft incur \$5,000 in out of pocket expenses

Myth: Car theft is only a big city problem

Fact: In Australia, more than 1 in 3 vehicles are stolen from a non-metropolitan region

LOCK all doors and windows and ensure everyone in your home is doing the same.

STOP sneak theft.

Myth: I always park my car in the garage or driveway, so it is safe.

Fact: 1 in 2 cars are stolen from the home by the thief gaining access to the car keys.

POP keys out of sight.

LOCK all doors and windows and ensure everyone in your home is doing the same.

STOP sneak thefts.

The NMVTRC and (COUNCIL NAME) are working to highlight the simple steps you can take to reduce your risk.

Myth: Thieves will come looking for my keys if I don't leave them in an obvious spot.

Fact: Most car thieves actively avoid confrontation with homeowners. In many cases if a thief is unable to easily locate the keys, they will move on.

LOCK all doors and windows and ensure everyone in your home is doing the same.
