The latest Torpedo 42 hull, powered by twin Volvo Penta IPS 650 engines, will be delivered in the last quarter of 2023. It will feature an eye-catching Midnight Blue hull together with a trademark mahogany deck. The 18 coats of varnish, offset by red and white diamond-stitched fabrics will bring an entirely new level of elegance to the American marketplace. Indeed, the Torpedo is much more than an achingly beautiful collection of lines and curves with her classic, figure-of-eight shape. She can reach speeds in excess of 50 mph and offers exceptional maneuverability. Her hull shape, refined over two dozen builds, delivers excellent stability and performance in any sea state, as well as an impressive 280-nm range. The convertible open cockpit features two sundecks, comfortably accommodating up to 10 adults for day cruises. The spacious cabin sleeps up to 4 guests in luxurious style. "For 15 years I have watched how seamlessly our J-Craft Torpedos

match the Mediterranean luxury dayboat lifestyle," said Radenko Milakovic, company owner since 2008.
