


The Wellington Heritage Festival



Wellington Heritage Festival celebrates the wealth of history throughout Te Upoko-o-Te-lka-a-Māui (the Greater Wellington Region) through talks, walks, exhibitions, and more. We started with 22 events in 2017 and have grown to over 150 in 2024. The whakatauki 'ka mua, ka muri', 'walking backwards into the future' is a reminder that our heritage is not just about what has been but is a guide for what is yet to come.

Our Festival is volunteer led and is jointly delivered by the Rotary Clubs of Greater Wellington and the Wellington Heritage Festival Trust - a charitable trust.



The Friends of the Wellington Heritage Festival was established to support the recognition of heritage entities, places and events that are in or take place in the Wellington and Wairarapa Regions. Each year, since its inauguration in 2017, the Heritage Festival has offered a growing number of diverse events, most of which are free or low cost. We profile our forebearers and celebrate the history of our Wellington Region. Did you know there are more than 80+ organizations from central government and the private sector which have their origins in Wellington such as Public Trust, Bell Gully, Bank of New Zealand, Cooperative Bank, Medical Assurance Society to name just a few.

The Friends of the Wellington Heritage Festival support our kaupapa (purpose) to ensure that we can operate an annual or, depending on funding, more frequent events to recognise the rich heritage we have within the Greater Wellington Region.

How is the Festival funded?

As the services provided by the Wellington Heritage Festival Trust are free to event hosts, a fair question is: "How we are funded?"

- Wellington Heritage Festival is funded by sponsorships, donations, public grants, and our Friends.
- Our sponsors and donors are, with their permission, highlighted on our website, printed brochures, and social media channels to thank them for their contributions, as the Festival cannot run without their support.
- The costs of organizing and holding an annual festival with over 150 events/visits/talks/tours have reached the stage that the future of the Festival urgently requires sustainable long-term funding.
- We have been reliant on grants and donations from several philanthropic organisations but that is
 proving harder each year as they too are struggling for funds to distribute and as the number of
 worthy causes grow.
- We also want to acknowledge the organisations that, over 100 years ago, helped shape the Wellington Region we know today.

The Trustees' intention is to cement the Festival in the Region's calendar and ensure that funds are available each year to operate it. Funding needed for 2024 was \$90,000. Annual growth will see this increase, at least a little, annually.
