Congressional Update

Telehealth

- On May 8th, the House Ways and Means Committee marked up H.R. 8261, the Preserving Telehealth,
 Hospital, and Ambulance Access Act (bill text; one-pager). The bill passed out of the Committee by a vote
 of 41-0
 - The bill would extend many of the current Medicare telehealth flexibilities through December 31, 2026, an additional two years. The bill would also extends the Acute Hospital Care at Home program through CY 2029.
- On May 16th, the House Energy and Commerce (E&C) Subcommittee on Health marked up H.R. 7623, the
 Telehealth Modernization Act (bill text), which CHIME previously endorsed. H.R. 7623 was reported
 favorably out of the Subcommittee by a roll call vote of 21-0.

Privacy

Tomorrow, the House Energy and Commerce (E&C) Subcommittee on Innovation, Data, and Commerce is
 <u>marking up</u> three bills including the American Privacy Rights Act <u>discussion draft</u> (175 pages)



Congressional Update

Cybersecurity

- On May 1st, both the Senate Finance Committee (<u>link</u>) and the House Energy and Commerce (E&C) Oversight and Investigations (O&I) Subcommittee (<u>link</u>) had UnitedHealth Group CEO Andrew Witty in to testify regarding the Change Healthcare cyberattack.

Artificial Intelligence (AI)

Senate

- Last week, a bipartisan group of senators, led by Senate Majority
 Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY), unveiled an <u>Artificial Intelligence</u>
 (Al) roadmap
- Roadmap does a few things:
 - Summarizes key findings from the Senate's Al insight forums last year
 - Lists who participated in each forum
 - Identifies key policy topics that merit bipartisan consideration in the 118th Congress and beyond

House

- The House side has their own bipartisan Al taskforce led by Chair Jay Obernolte (CA-23) and Co-Chair Ted Lieu (CA-36)
 - The taskforce's top objective is to produce a comprehensive report that will include guiding principles and recommendations


