His built work, is mostly result of winning public competitions, and it has been recognized nationally and internationally. In addition to his professional work as an architect, he has developed activity as teacher, researcher and curator, in the filed of housing, urban and renovation.

His teaching experience includes 12 years as an Associate Professor at the University of Madrid, and 8 years as a visiting professor at various international universities. Educated in interior architecture in Beirut and Milan, Rawan's career began in designing retail and hospitality interiors in Amman and Beirut. During this time, the turbulent political landscape of the region led to a strong shift in perspective that prompted her to acquire knowledge in placemaking. In the process of founding a crowdfunding initiative to improve public space in Amman, Rawan secured a mentorship with the UN - Entrepreneurs for Social Change and gained an opportunity to speak at the UN World Cities Day in New York.

This path led to Dubai in 2015 where she generated exhibitions, public-realm installations and knowledge-exchange programmes with the Art Dubai Group; as Head of Programming for two editions of Design Days Dubai, the Middle East's first collectible design fair, and as Head of Programming and Creative Director of five editions of Dubai Design Week, the region's largest design festival, where she was responsible for the development of content through national and international partnerships, and working with diverse stakeholders to develop and deliver projects to strengthen the regional creative economies and design landscape. Collectively, these experiences have offered significant access to a broad scope of talent from the Arab world and has fuelled Rawan's desire to ensure access to it is improved.
