

EVENT SUMMARY

Clean water, food and energy are critical for survival, and its absence can impact the health, food security, and livelihoods of families across the world and that of future generations. As we move towards a global population of 10 billion in 2050, there is increasing pressure on current ecosystems to meet the burgeoning demand for these resources without further eroding the ecosystem.

Jordan, Netherlands and UAE have been at the forefront of water, food, and energy (WFE) nexus and have been collaborating to advance innovative approaches within this space. Through this summit the co-curators aim to increase the collective understanding of the interdependent relationships between water, food, and energy security and solutions that integrate the three amidst the on-going collaborations between the three countries on this front. This trilateral summit, a first of its kind meeting that will provide a platform for exchange of information, promising practices and learnings for increased water, food and energy security while strengthening regional and international policies and cooperation.

The event will commence with **Natalie Becker-Aakervik**, Founder and Storyteller, Thought Leader Global, welcoming attendees and providing an overview of the diverse programme of the day.

H.E. Mariam bint Mohammed Saeed Hareb Almheiri, Minister of Climate Change and Environment and Minister of Food Security, United Arab Emirates, will then introduce the attendees to the day's context and provide an overview of the challenges related to global hunger, rising constraints of water stress and the need to shift rapidly to renewable energy sources.

This session will begin with brief opening remarks an introduction to the session by **Prof. Louise Fresco** (virtual), President of the Wageningen University & Research Executive Board.

This will be followed by statements from a representative of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan; **HE Liesje Schreinemacher (Virtual)**, Minister for Foreign Trade and Development Cooperation; and a representative of the United Arab Emirates, each of whom will underscore their country's commitment to advance the WFE nexus approach to solve global challenges and facilitate collaborations and partnerships in this area.

In this moderated fireside chat, **H.E. Nasser Kamel** (virtual), Secretary General, Union for the Mediterranean and **Dr. Agnes M. Kalibata** (virtual), UN Secretary General's Special Envoy for the Food System's Summit will highlight the importance of WFE in geo-politics, youth, and disadvantaged population. The speakers will speak to the centrality of WFE to minimise the impact and shape the future course of global health emergencies, climate change and the underlying socio-economic challenges.

Prof. Louise O. Fresco has been the President of the Wageningen University & Research Executive Board since 1 July 2014. From 1997 to 2006, she held various positions at the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations, including that of Assistant Director-General of the Agriculture Department in Rome, Italy. Prof. Fresco has served in various capacities (member, director, etc.) at numerous national and international institutions including the Royal Swedish Academy of Agriculture and Forestry, the Real Academia de Ingeniería in Spain, the Consultative Group for International Agricultural Research (CGIAR), the Asia Vegetable Research Development Center and CIRAD. She has served as President of the Advisory Council for Research on Nature and Environment in the Netherlands, Vice-Chair of the Council of the United Nations University, and is a member of the Trilateral Commission, the Supervisory Board of Rabobank and Crown member of the Social and Economic Council of the Netherlands. Her graduate work in Zambia and UN volunteer services in Papua New Guinea led to further extensive international experience in Africa and Latin America. Prof. Fresco received her Ph.D. in Tropical Crop Science from Wageningen University and then served as Professor of Plant Production Systems and Chair of the Department of Agronomy at the same institution.

H.E. LISJE SCHREINEMACHERMinister for Foreign Trade and Development Cooperation, Kingdom of Netherlands

Lisje Schreinemacher is the current Dutch minister for Minister for Foreign Trade and Development Cooperation. Earlier in her carreer Schreinemacher served as a member of the European Parliament in from 2019 to 2022. Between 2009 and 2017, Schreinemacher served as personal assistant to two members of the VVD parliamentary party as well as a political assistant to the Minister of Defence. She has also worked as a lawyer from 2016 to 2019.

Schreinemacher graduated from the University of Amsterdam in 2008 with a Master in Communication Science. As part of this degree, she undertook electives at San Francisco State University and the Paris Institute of Political Studies. In 2012, she obtained a Bachelor of Laws degree from the University of Amsterdam, before going on to Leiden University, where she obtained a Master in civil law in 2015.





JAYATHMA WICKRAMANAYAKEUN Secretary-General's Envoy on Youth

Ms. Jayathma Wickramanayake was appointed as the UN Secretary-General's Envoy on Youth in June 2017. In this role, Ms. Wickramanayake works to expand the UN's youth engagement and advocacy efforts across all four pillars of work – sustainable development, human rights, peace and security and humanitarian action – and serves as a representative of and advisor to the Secretary-General. Originally from Sri Lanka, Ms. Wickramanayake has worked extensively on youth development and participation, and has played a key role in transforming the youth development sector in her home country. Prior to taking up her post, Ms. Wickramanayake was instrumental in creating the movement for civic and political engagement of young people, especially young women in Sri Lanka named "Hashtag Generation". She has been an advocate for global youth development on an international level including as the first ever Sri Lankan Youth Delegate to the United Nations and as the youth lead negotiator and member of the International Youth Task Force of the World Conference on Youth 2014.

H.E. NASSER KAMEL Secretary General, Union for the Mediterranean (UfM)

A career diplomat for the Egyptian government, Mr. Kamel held the position of Ambassador of Egypt to the United Kingdom from 2014 to 2018. He was also Ambassador to France in the period 2006-2012, during which he took part in the drafting of the Joint Declaration of the 2008 Paris Summit that marked the launch of the Union for the Mediterranean. Furthermore, between 2012 and 2014, he was Assistant Minister for Arab and Middle Eastern Affairs. From 2004 to 2006, he was the Director of Egypt's Public Information Service. Prior to this position he served in various embassies, including Washington, Lisbon, Tunis, Brussels and Paris. Mr. Kamel studied Political Science at Brussels University and Cairo University's Faculty of Economics and Political Science, obtaining his bachelor's degree in 1981. He graduated from the Diplomatic Institute – Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Cairo and the École Nationale d'Administration (ENA) in Paris. He holds the title of Grand Officier de l'Ordre National du Mérite of the Republic of France and has also received decorations from the Kingdom of Belgium and the Republic of Portugal.

DR. AGNES KALIBATAUN Secretary-General's Special Envoy to the 2021 Food Systems Summit

Dr. Kalibata has a distinguished track record as an agricultural scientist, policymaker and thought leader. Recently, she has provided leadership, guidance and strategic direction towards the 2021 Food Systems Summit such that it serves as a catalytic process within the Decade of Action to improve food systems around the world to deliver on the SDGs and Paris Agreement.

Born in Rwanda to smallholder farmer parents displaced during the struggle for independence in the early 1960s, Dr. Kalibata grew up at a refugee camp in Uganda, went on to study entomology and biochemistry at Makerere University before earning her PhD from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst. Dr Kalibata returned to Rwanda to become the Minister of Agriculture and Animal Resources (MINAGRI) from 2008 to 2014. The success of Dr. Kalibata's tenure as agriculture minister contributed towards moving her country from a food insecure to a food secure status.

Since 2014, Dr. Kalibata has also served as President of the Alliance for a Green Revolution in Africa (AGRA). She leads the organization's efforts with public and private partners to ensure a food secure and prosperous Africa through rapid, sustainable agricultural growth, improving the productivity and livelihoods of millions of smallholder farmers in Africa.

She has been awarded the Yara Prize, the Africa Food Prize; an Honorary Doctorate from the University of Liège; an Honorary Doctorate from McGill University; and the Public Welfare Medal of the National Academy of Sciences for her work to drive Africa's agricultural transformation.

H.E. FRANCESCO LA CAMERADirector-General, International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA)

Under Mr Camera's leadership, IRENA has forged new strategic partnerships with UN organisations including UNDP, UNFCCC and Green Climate Fund among others. Previously, he served as Director-General of Sustainable Development, Environmental Damage, EU and International Affairs at the Italian Ministry of Environment, Land & Sea. As the national coordinator for climate, environment, resource efficiency and circular economy, he led the Italian delegation to UNFCCC's COP 21 to 24 and the EU Presidency at COP 20. He was responsible for the preparation and organisation of Italy's G7 Environment Presidency in 2017 and a leading member of the Italian delegation to the G7 Environment Ministers meetings in 2016 and 2018. He was co-chair of the Africa Centre for Climate and Sustainable Development established in Rome in partnership with FAO and UNDP and co-chaired the Financial Platform for Climate and Sustainable Development in partnership with the Italian Development Bank Cassa Depositi e Prestiti. He chaired the meetings of the Signatories to the Aarhus Convention led by the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe and chaired the advisory board for the Convention's implementation. Mr. La Camera was a Lecturer of Sustainable Development at the University of Cosenza and of Environment & Land Economics at the University of Roma.

H.E. MATHIAS CORMANNSecretary-General of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development(OECD)

Prior to his appointment to the OECD, Mr. Cormann served as the Australian Minister for Finance, the Leader of the Government in the Australian Senate and as Federal Senator representing the State of Western Australia. In these roles, he has been a strong advocate for the positive power of open markets, free trade and the importance of a rules-based international trading system. Mr. Cormann had graduated in law at the Flemish Catholic University of Louvain (Leuven), following studies at the University of Namur and, as part of the European Erasmus Student Exchange Program, at the University of East Anglia. Between 1997 and 2003, he worked as Chief of Staff as well as Senior Adviser to various State and Federal Ministers in Australia and for the Premier of Western Australia. Between 2003 and 2007, Mr. Cormann worked for major Western Australian health insurer HBF in a range of senior management roles.

H.E. JUTTA URPILAINENEuropean Commissioner for International Partnerships

As European Commissioner for International Partnerships, Ms. Jutta Urpilainen oversees the European Commission's work on international cooperation and sustainable development. Before joining the Commission, Ms. Urpilainen served as a Member of the Finnish Parliament from 2003 to 2019. In 2008, she became the first woman leader of the Social Democratic Party of Finland. From 2011 to 2014, she served as Finland's Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister. During that time, she became closely involved in development issues, joining the Development Committee of the World Bank Group and IMF and chairing the Finnish National Commission on Sustainable Development. She served as the Foreign Minister's Special Representative on Mediation (2017-19) and chaired the Finnish National Commission for UNESCO (2015-18).

She has previously been a part of the World Bank Group and the International Monetary Fund (IMF) Development Committee. Ms. Urpilainen completed her Master of Educational Sciences, University of Jyväskylä in 2002 and was an Erasmus student in Vienna 1998.

Ms. Prins devotes a large part of her life to promoting sustainability, innovation and internationalisation. She is a much sought-after authority in this field. DR. GUNTER PAULI Entrepreneur, pedagogue and author

Dr. Pauli pioneers innovations and creates new (disruptive) business models. He accompanied over 200 projects over the past quarter of a century, translating ideas with solid science into a vision implemented through entrepreneurship. These initiatives have evolved in three unicorns and dozens of demonstrations on how to transform society. Dr. Pauli adheres to a philosophy summarized in his book "The Blue Economy" (2010) translated in more than 50 languages. He proposes to avoid dividing opinions centered around "for or against". He embraces radical change, shifting from the obsession to ever higher levels of efficiency, globalization and ever lower prices, to resilience and the capacity to better respond to the basic needs of all, by generating value with what is locally available. FELIX BROOKS-CHURCHCo-Founder and CEO, Sanku-Project Healthy Children ("Sanku")

Felix Brooks-church co-founded and leads Sanku, a fast-growing social enterprise working to combat hidden hunger and save lives by giving small mills the tools they need to fortify maize flour, an East African staple. Food fortification (i.e. adding vital nutrients to food during processing) is one of the most cost-effective nutrition interventions, but, before Sanku, fortification efforts focused primarily on industrial level milling, leaving the 6.5 billion people in developing countries who rely on small, often rural, mills for most of their food behind.

Felix has spent more than a decade developing and refining solutions for small-scale fortification and led all aspects of product development and engineering for Sanku's award-winning fortification technology and sustainable business model. His work has gained international recognition, leading to his selection as a Rainer Arnhold Fellow, a Rolex Awards for Enterprise Laureate and to Sanku winning the Zayed Sustainability Prize in 2019.

Through its network of close to 700 small fortifying mills Sanku provides 3 million East Africans sustainable access to the basic human right of nutritious food and aims to reach 100 million people this decade. Sanku's mission: guarantee that every meal consumed by every mother and child, contains lifesaving nutrients, forever.
