MAYOR'S Message

Welcome to the March edition of City Views.

The start of the year has already brought some important moments for our City, with new facilities opening, community achievements recognised and a wide range of events and programs to support people at every stage of life.

One of the most exciting developments has been the opening of the Armadale University Study Hub at its new home on Jull Street. The project has breathed new life into the much loved former Council building, which has played a prominent role in Armadale's civic and education history. Originally constructed in the mid 1960's it served as the Shire of Armadale Kelmscott Council Chambers and administration offices for two decades and more recently has been used for education and training purposes. The carefully considered renovation has respected the building's considerable heritage value, whilst transforming it for a new generation of learners and potential leaders.

Today, the Armadale University Study Hub provides a mix of open and quiet study spaces, supported by well equipped meeting rooms, reliable internet and hard-wired technology. The large quiet study area opens onto a balcony nestled in the trees, offering a calm space with a connection to nature. The Hub is staffed during the week, enabling students to seek support and guidance, and make them feel comfortable using the facilities. Secure access is available outside business hours, to allow study and collaboration flexibility.

The Armadale University Study Hub allows local students to study, connect and access support close to home, whilst also reflecting the City's commitment to the adaptive reuse of the City's iconic buildings and investing in the education of our community. This has been a great example of different levels of government working together and our thanks go to our partners in this achievement, with the project being supported by the Australian Government through the Suburban University Study Hubs Program.

I would like to congratulate our 2026 Citizen of the Year Award recipients and thank them for their contributions to strengthening our community. On Australia Day, Daniel Ramsell and Emily Addink both received the 2026 Community Citizen of the Year Award, Christine Cairns received the 2026 Senior Community Citizen of the Year Award, and the Armadale Police Rangers were recipients of the 2026 Active Citizenship Award. These Awards highlight the individuals and groups who quietly and consistently make a difference in the lives of others.

As we move through the Noongar season of Bunuru, this edition of City Views highlights many ways our community can get outdoors and get involved. There are lots of free outdoor events happening soon, such as Movies in March, Music in the Park and Yoga in the Park, guided bush walks and family friendly events like Dogs' Day Out. There are plenty of opportunities to enjoy our parks and spend time together.

I wish you a safe and enjoyable time ahead and look forward to seeing you out and about across our City.

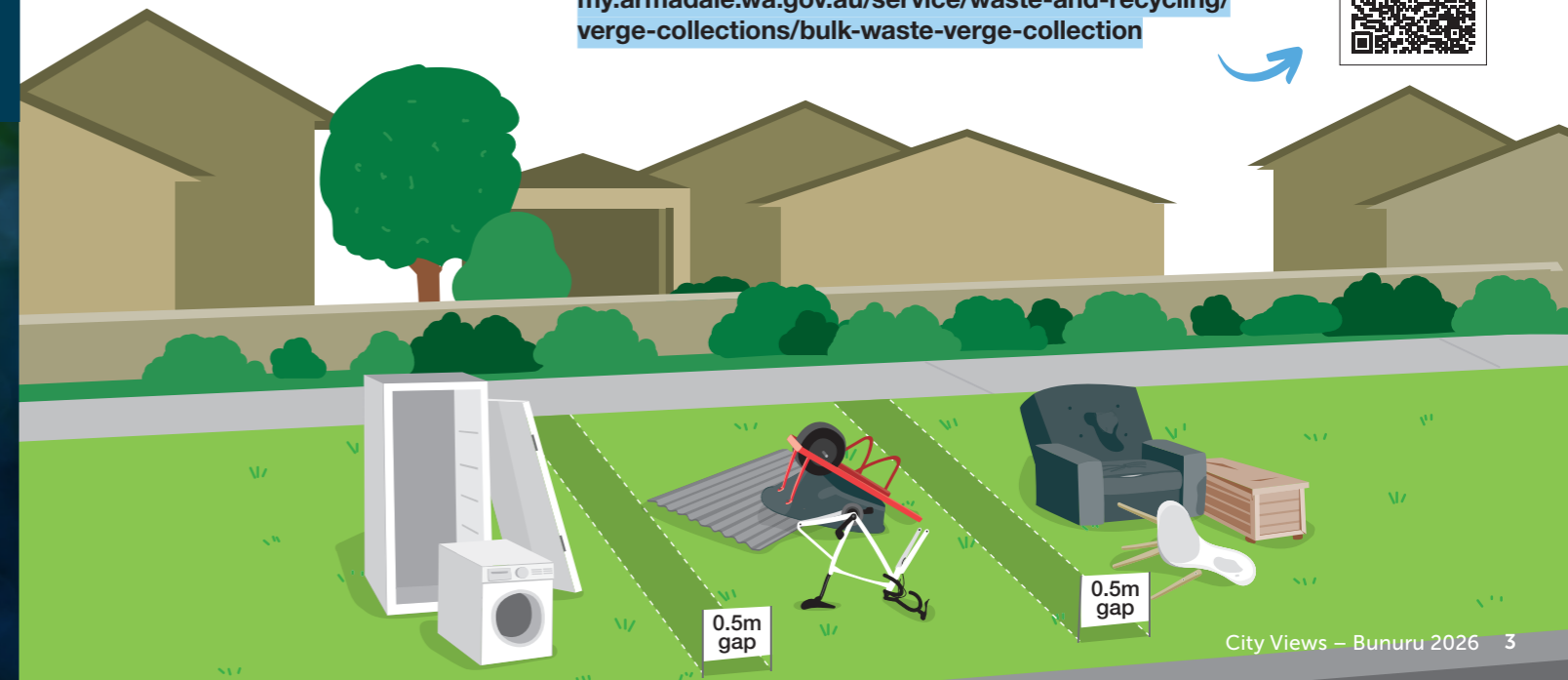

ARMADALE UNIVERSITY STUDY HUB

is now open

The Armadale University Study Hub, now operating from its new home at 145 Jull Street, provides local students with a welcoming, fully accessible place to study, connect and access support, offering a local alternative to travelling to campus.

The Armadale University Study Hub service has been supporting students from a temporary location at Armadale Library, with the transition to the new purpose-built facility completed in February this year. The new space offers quiet study areas, reliable internet and access to academic support, helping students balance study with work and other commitments.

Designed to be safe, accessible, and inclusive, the Hub supports people at all stages of their education journey, from recent school leavers to those returning to or choosing to study later in life. Flexible access hours allow students to study at times that suit their lives.

Part of the Suburban University Study Hubs network, the Armadale Hub connects students with universities across Western Australia while keeping learning local. It reflects the City's ongoing commitment to creating opportunities, supporting education and investing in the future of our community.

WALKING TOWARDS PARTNERSHIPS

Through Guided Tours

The City of Armadale continues to invest in tourism through a new partnership with Western Australian guided-walk operator, The Hike Collective, delivering curated trail experiences across the region.

Developed as part of the Six Seasons Trails project, the guided walking program positions Armadale's trails

network as a cultural and nature-based experience informed by the Noongar seasonal calendar.

The initiative supports the City's commitment to sustainable tourism, culture and increased engagement with local landscapes.

The guided tours provide participants with structured, high-quality experiences led by professional

guides, incorporating local history, environmental interpretation and insight into the region's diverse flora and fauna.

This program offers residents and visitors a new way to experience Armadale's trails, reinforcing the City's roles as a destination for meaningful well-curated outdoor experiences.

DRIVING HOUSING GROWTH

in Perth South-East Corridor

Local government leaders, industry experts and developers came together for the sold-out South East Corridor Council Alliance (SECCA) Housing Forum, held on 2 December 2025 at the City of Canning.

Led by the City of Armadale and delivered in partnership with Business News, the forum focused on population growth, housing demand and opportunities for well-planned, higher-density development around METRONET stations.

A panel featuring Urbis, Celsius Property Group and Cedar Woods highlighted the south-east corridor as one of Western Australia's most viable areas for future housing growth.

SECCA represents the Cities of Armadale, Canning, Gosnells and the Town of Victoria Park, a community of more than 400,000 residents. United by a shared vision to be one of Western Australia's most sustainable metropolitan corridors, SECCA continues to advocate for the infrastructure and investment needed to support sustainable growth – ensuring the south-east remains a connected, liveable and thriving place to live.

History House Museum

On 25 April 1976, History House Museum was officially opened by retired Governor General Sir Paul Hasluck for the Armadale Kelmscott Historical Society. Designed by Phil Pritchard and built by Gerrit 'Harry' Bosveld, the museum's first curator was Margaret Bettenay.

In 2026, we're celebrating this milestone with a vibrant year of events! Highlights include an open day, curator talks, a concert featuring musical instruments from the collection, and a workshop on caring for family treasures. A special display will tell the story of the museum's founding, and a new wildflower garden will honour the one planted in 1976 by the Armadale Branch of the Wildflower Society. We'll also launch a commemorative publication featuring favourite objects from the collection.

URBAN FOREST GREENING PROGRAM

Creating a greener, cooler Armadale starts right outside your front door. That's why the City is continuing its Urban Forest Greening Program, offering free verge trees to residents again this year.

As our suburbs grow and our climate warms, urban heat islands are becoming a bigger challenge. Hard surfaces like roads, roofs and footpaths absorb and hold heat, making some areas noticeably hotter during the day and slower to cool at night. With less shade and greenery, temperatures can quickly rise.

Trees are one of the easiest and most effective ways to tackle this. They provide natural shade, cool the air through transpiration, and help reduce heat around homes and buildings.

When combined with other greening efforts, planting trees can lower local temperatures by 1-7°C – making our streets more comfortable and liveable for everyone.

HABITAT LINKS

Could your property be a haven for native animals? If your land is zoned General Rural, Rural Living, or Special Residential; and contains or is near bushland, wetlands, or watercourses – you may be eligible for the City's Habitat Links program.

This program helps you enhance wildlife habitats by offering support for revegetation, plus access to free native seedlings (in season). You'll also receive expert advice on feral animal management and weed control, and have the opportunity to attend workshops and network with other participants.

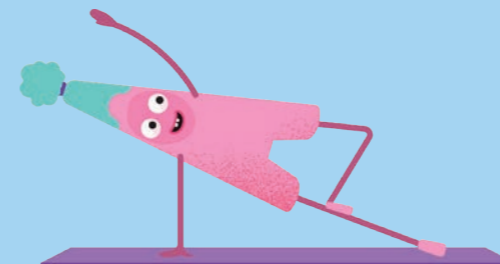

STAYING INFORMED WITH THE Emergency WA app

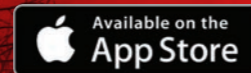
Emergencies can happen quickly and having reliable up-to-date information is one of the most important ways to keep your family safe.

The Emergency WA app is Western Australia's official source for timely alerts and warnings giving you fast access to information during bushfires, storms, floods and other hazards.

Key features of the Emergency WA app

- ✔ Create up to 10 personalised watch zones so you receive timely, trustworthy alerts for locations important to you
- ✔ Choose the types of alerts you want to receive including fires, storms, floods, burn-offs, Total Fire Bans and Fire Danger Ratings
- ✔ Create personalised emergency plans and receive prompts to activate them when an emergency occurs in your linked watch zone
- ✔ View warnings and incidents on an interactive map
- ✔ Access and listen live to ABC emergency broadcasts
- ✔ Listen to warnings through a read-aloud tool that improves accessibility with audio and haptic feedback
- ✔ Call Triple Zero (000) from anywhere in the app

A QUICK REMINDER ABOUT

Safe School Parking

With the new school year underway and families settling back into routine, it's a good time to revisit safe parking habits around our local schools.

Mornings and afternoons can be busy and a little extra care goes a long way in keeping students, parents and staff safe.

Parents and carers can help by:

- ☺ Checking parking restriction signage and ensuring you only park in designated areas
- ☺ Keeping footpaths and driveways clear so the area remains safe and accessible for everyone
- ☺ Planning ahead by allowing extra time, parking a short distance away or arriving before peak pick-up times
- ☺ Considering other travel options like walking, cycling or carpooling to help reduce congestion

By working together and staying patient during the busy school rush we can help create safer school zones for everyone.

WARM WEATHER

And mosquito control

With warmer weather arriving, mosquitoes are becoming more active across the City. Higher-than-average rainfall has also created more standing water, which provides ideal breeding conditions.

City officers are implementing the City's Mosquito Management Plan by monitoring known breeding areas, carrying out treatments where needed, and working closely with neighbouring local governments and the Department of Health to help reduce mosquito numbers and protect public health. You can still enjoy the outdoors, just remember to Fight the Bite.

How you can help protect yourself and others:

- 🔥 Keep drains and gutters clear
- 🔥 Covering anything that can hold water
- 🔥 Ensure swimming pools are well maintained
- 🔥 Make sure window and door screens are well fitted and in good condition
- 🔥 Use an effective insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltoluamide), picaridin or oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE), especially at dawn and dusk
- 🔥 Wear loose, light-coloured, long-sleeved clothing where possible
- 🔥 Remove or tip out standing water around your home, including pot saucers, buckets, tyres and unused containers

Small changes around your yard and simple precautions while outdoors can make a big difference in reducing mosquito breeding and keeping our community protected this season.
