

Transporting Hemp in Louisiana

Guidelines from the Louisiana Department of Agriculture & Forestry

LDAF is continually working with law enforcement agencies to facilitate uninterrupted transportation of legal industrial hemp in Louisiana.

What records are required during transportation?

Any person transporting hemp must have a dated invoice, bill of lading, or manifest in their possession, and must include the seller's and purchaser's name and address, the origin and destination and quantity transported.

Do I need to carry my industrial hemp license?

Although not required, LDAF strongly encourages you to carry your license when transporting any hemp seeds, plants or plant material.

The more information you have available for your hemp plants or plant material, the less likely you are to have transportation interruptions.

NOTICE: It is the transporter's responsibility to ensure compliance with all other state and federal agencies.

Additional information to avoid transportation interruptions...

- Official THC Certificate of Analysis
- Licensee or permit information from material originated from out-of-state
- If traveling out-of-state... Know that state's requirements prior to transporting
- Any other supporting documentation

Did you supply LDAF your list of potential drivers?

- Licensees may voluntarily submit a list of industrial hemp transport drivers to LDAF
- LDAF will make that list available to law enforcement agencies
- This is just another step that can be taken by licensees to prevent transport interruptions
