Prices reflect total volume and total value ratios paid from bid and negotiated sales. Values do not represent inter- or intra-company transactions and long-term contracts. The purpose of the report is (1) to provide a guide for private timber owners in determining stumpage prices regionally or statewide, (2) establish annual stumpage price figures for severance tax purposes and (3) determine the timber value for use-value assessment of forest land.

## **2020 SECOND QUARTER MARKET SUMMARY**

Stumpage prices paid for pine sawtimber during the second quarter of 2020 averaged \$268.48 per thousand board feet Doyle. This average represents a 1.4 percent increase from the previous quarter and 1.1 percent increase compared to a year ago. Prices paid for mixed hardwood sawtimber during the second quarter of 2020 averaged \$379.81 per thousand board feet Doyle which is a 13.7 percent lower from the previous quarter and 22.4 percent lower than a year ago. Pulpwood stumpage prices averaged \$29.37 per standard cord for pine and \$31.43 per standard cord for hardwood.

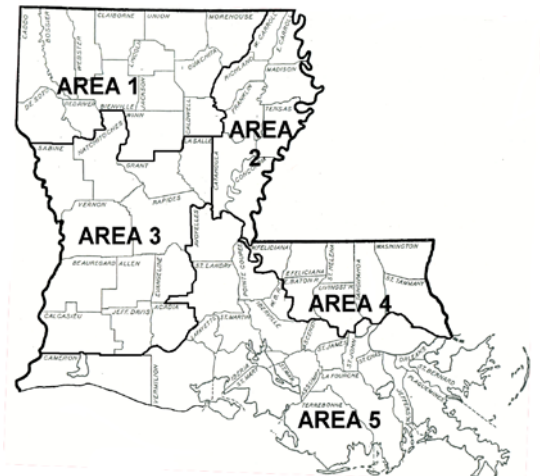
