GRADE 7 LESSON: ANIMALS AND US

GOALS

The overall purpose of this lesson is to

- 1. teach students about the three tenets of responsible pet partnership (provide, protect and prevent);
- 2. help students understand the financial and emotional responsibilities associated with being a responsible pet owner;
- 3. teach students about the human-animal relationship, and why cultivating this relationship is important;
- 4. help students understand how the Humane Society works to nurture and preserve the human-animal bond in our communities, and within the four walls of the shelter.

STUDENT OBJECTIVES

After this lesson students will be able to

- 1. talk about the importance of the human-animal relationship as it relates to their own lives, and the importance of this relationship in communities;
- 2. have more compassion for members of their community who are pet owners experiencing homelessness;
- 3. understand the KWSP Humane Society's role in preserving the human-animal bond, and speak about the work they do to preserve this bond;
- 4. understand the role and responsibility of pet ownership.
