Leeds United Football Club recognises its responsibility to proactively limit its impact on the environment and reduce its carbon footprint.

This environmental policy has been established to outline the club's approach to reducing our environmental footprint, relating to construction and operations across all of our sites, including Elland Road Stadium and Thorp Arch Training Ground.

Our ongoing environmental programme builds upon our progress in recent years across impact areas such as energy efficiency, single-use plastics, waste management, sustainable food and biodiversity.

Leeds United Football Club seeks to:

- Prevent pollution and reduce its environmental footprint
- Comply with environmental legislation and other associated obligations
- Continually improve environmental management systems and processes
- Communicate and publish this policy to all employees and external stakeholders including partners, suppliers and fans.

Environmental policy, activities and objectives are centrally managed by the Facilities Team, in coordination with responsible persons and nominated representatives across the club, with senior management holding overall accountability. Environmental objectives and targets will be reviewed on an annual basis. Our approach will also be shaped by engagement with relevant external stakeholders.

We will communicate regularly about our environmental programme through club channels, and assess and report on our environmental progress annually.

This policy is ratified by the MD of Leeds United Football Club, and this policy will be reviewed every 3 years or when necessary due to changing legislation or guidance.
