

Cookie policy

What are cookies?

A cookie is a small text file that a website asks to store on a visitor's computer, tablet or smartphone. Many websites use cookies to give visitors access to various functions. The data in cookies can also be used to track the user's browsing on websites that use the same cookies.

How do I avoid cookies?

Most browsers can be configured to block the use of cookies. You can also set your browser to ask you to accept each new cookie a website sends to your computer. See the instructions in your browser's help section.

What do we use cookies for?

We use cookies to make the website work effectively, compile anonymous, aggregated statistics to understand how users use the website so that we can improve the website and deliver a good user experience based on user needs.

Which cookies do we use?

We use cookies on our public web pages and our encrypted login web pages.

Essential cookies

We use essential cookies on our encrypted login web pages to ensure the website functions properly, e.g. remembers your selections and settings as you move between pages. Your consent is not required for the use of essential cookies because they are necessary for us to provide the services you request. This type of cookie cannot be disabled in our system. You can, however, set your browser to block or alert you about these cookies, but some parts of the site will not then work.

The essential cookies are set only by us and not by a third party. Nor do we share your details with any third party.

We use the following essential cookies found in your web browser under the name:
