Bio

Council Member Mike Siegel, representing Austin's District 7, brings a wealth of experience in law, education, and community activism to his role. Born in Oakland, California, Council Member Siegel earned a bachelor's degree from Brandeis University, a law degree from Cornell Law School, and a teaching credential from California State University. He began his career as a public school teacher with Teach for America, teaching third, fifth, and eighth grades, and was actively involved in his teachers' union. Transitioning to law, Council Member Siegel co-founded two nonprofit education organizations, including Oakland Leaf, where he served as executive director. He also worked as a civil rights attorney and served as an Assistant City Attorney in Austin from June 2015 to 2018. As a council member, Council Member Siegel focuses on climate action, advocating for partnerships to advance renewable energy goals, and addressing public safety by improving police response times and officer retention. He also supports affordable housing initiatives, aiming to make housing accessible for working-class Austinites. Council Member Siegel's diverse background and commitment to social justice continue to shape his approach to serving the residents of District 7 and the broader Austin community.

The City of Austin's APD District Representative Program was established for the purpose of creating a liaison between neighborhood communities and APD.



District 7 is located in northeast Austin, with portions of the district stretching into central Austin. MoPac runs through District 7 south to north, connecting prominent neighborhoods such as Allandale, Brentwood, and Crestview in the south to neighborhoods such as Milwood and McNeil/Ashton Woods in the north.
