In March, Central Texans will head to the polls for the Primary Elections for local, state, and federal offices – and in Texas, the March primary often matters the most. In the 2022 Midterm Elections, **97% of Texas House seats** (146 out of 150 seats) were all but decided in the March primaries, and yet **only about 18%** of registered Texas voters turned out to vote. **March 3, 2026**, will likely decide who represents you at the local, state, and federal levels.
