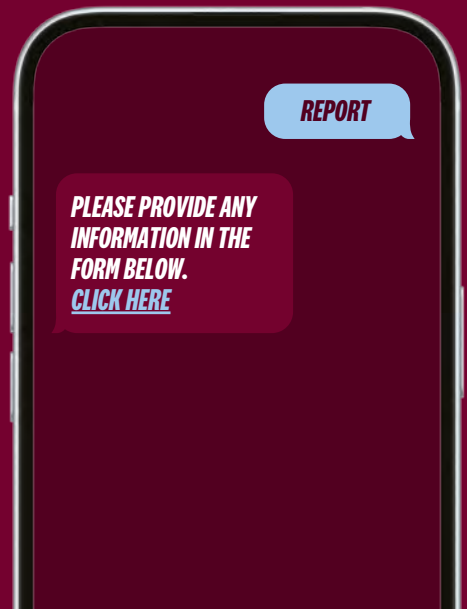

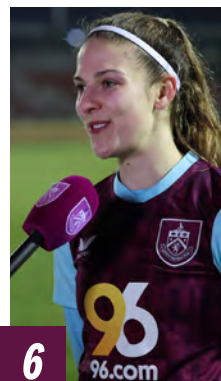

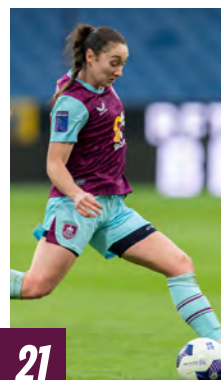

PROUD OF FIRST CAREER HAT-TRICK

FORWARD HEIDI LOGAN NETTED A FIRST CAREER HAT-TRICK AGAINST LIVERPOOL FEDS EARLIER THIS WEEK AND, HAVING COME SO CLOSE ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS, SHE ADMITTED IT WAS A DAY SHE WILL ALWAYS REMEMBER.

The three goals came on the back of two more against Halifax four days earlier and before the trip to Yorkshire shed had not scored in the league this season.

That duck is now well and truly behind her and, speaking shortly after the final whistle, Logan expressed her emotions after a successful few days.

"It's a really proud moment," she said.

"I've got two quite a few times and then the third has just never come, like on Sunday against Halifax.

"To get a hat-trick is really special for me but more importantly we got the win, and that's what really matters.

"Another clean sheet is great too and that will help build confidence for the whole team."

Head Coach Rebecca Sawiuk often talks about her desire for the team to be ruthless and that trait was showcased on Wednesday night.

Despite having a five-goal advantage, the Clarets continued to push forward in search of more with several players, including Logan, testing Feds' Northern Ireland international 'keeper Rachael Norney.





"Maybe I should have squared that last shot to Louanne (Worsey) – I'll pass it to her on Sunday!" Logan continued.

"We're relentless as a team and that's a key value for us. We have to keep going as we do, get more goals and more clean sheets.

"The attacking depth is so good here and that's really important, because it continues to push standards in training again and again."

Stoke are a familiar side for Logan as

the forward, who is comfortable anywhere across the attacking line, was on loan there from Charlton Athletic last season.

It was a successful season for her too, as she scored 14 times in 20 league appearances to win the division's top goal scorer award.

She finished: "Game day's the best day and I look forward to every match, but it will be nice to see some familiar faces from last

LAST TIME OUT

H EIDI LOGAN FOLLOWED A WEEKEND BRACE WITH A MIDWEEK HAT-TRICK AS BURNLEY WOMEN BEAT LIVERPOOL FEDS 5-0 ON WEDNESDAY NIGHT.

The winger was joined on the scoresheet by Laura Elford and Claudia Walker as the Clarets recorded a fifth straight win and clean sheet in all competitions.

There were five changes to the 11 that started Sunday's 7-0 victory at Halifax, with Emma Siddall and Naomi Hartley returning to the defence.

After her goalscoring cameo in Yorkshire Grace Palmer was given the nod in midfield, while Danielle Maxwell earned a first Burnley start on the right wing and Elford led the line.

It was a scrappy start with neither team able to retain possession for a sustained period and, having suffered an injury in a strong tackle, Palmer was withdrawn for Louanne Worsey after 21 minutes.

The deadlock was broken three minutes later when, after Maxwell's cross was half cleared, Amelia Hazard fed Elford who was able to turn and pick out the bottom right corner.

It was 2-0 soon after and Elford was involved again, producing a pinpoint pass to put Maxwell in one-on-one. Feds' keeper Rachael Norney saved with her legs, but Logan slotted the loose ball home.

The visitors grew into the game as the half progressed but were unable to work Kirstie Levell in Burnley's goal.

Elford came closest to finding a third goal of the night before

the interval but headed Siddall's deep cross wide.

Levell made her first save of the game less than 30 seconds after the restart but, in truth, it was a comfortable one from Beth Donoghue's effort.

Logan then put the result beyond any doubt with 52 minutes on the clock when, after Feds were unable to clear a Maxwell cross, the number seven swept home from six yards.

Head Coach Rebecca Sawiuk's first change of the evening saw Claudia Walker replace Elford and the in-form striker had an immediate impact, providing an assist a minute later.

Having been picked out by an inch-perfect pass from Georgia Marshall, Walker surged forward and squared for Logan to complete a first hat-trick of her career.

Aimee Kelly replaced Maxwell straight after the goal and Walker made it 5-0 soon after as she capitalised on slack defending to beat Norney at her near post.

Sawiuk then made the final two changes available to her, with Jade Richards coming on for Hartley and Hazard making way for debutant Louise McDaniel.

The Clarets were unrelenting in their pursuit for goals and after Logan forced Norney into a fine save, Worsey had an effort blocked behind.

Substitutes McDaniel and Richards and centre-back Marshall also had efforts go narrowly wide in the final 10 minutes as the Clarets scored five or more goals in a match for the eighth time this season.

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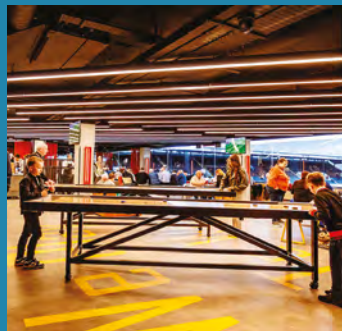

FIVE WOMEN'S INTERNATIONAL CALL-UPS ANNOUNCED



CLARETS TO HEAD OFF AROUND THE GLOBE THIS WEEK

BURNLEY WOMEN ARE CELEBRATING A FIRST, HAVING HAD FIVE PLAYERS CALLED UP BY THEIR COUNTRIES DURING THE INTERNATIONAL WINDOW THAT STARTS TOMORROW.

Brenna McPartlan will jet off to be with Northern Ireland, alongside January additions Danielle Maxwell and Louise McDaniel.

Elsewhere, Reanna Blades is linking up with Jamaica once again and young midfielder Ameila Oldroyd has been called up by Scotland U19s.

Because of the call-ups, the team's

trip to West Bromwich Albion that was scheduled for Sunday 23rd February has now been postponed.

Northern Ireland have two UEFA Women's Nations League B Group 1 matches, starting with a trip to Gdansk to take on Poland on Friday 21st February.

Four days later they will take to the field at Larne's Inver Park against Bosnia & Herzegovina.

Having been called up by Jamaica for the first time back in October for a friendly against France, Blades will once again link up with the 'Reggae Girlz' next week.

On the agenda is a training camp and friendly matches against Paraguay.

Finally, January addition Amelia Oldroyd has been called up Scotland U19s.

Th young Scots have back-to-back friendlies against Iceland at Broadwood Stadium in Cumbernauld, which act as valuable preparation for their final set of Round 2 UEFA European qualifiers at the start of April.

INTRODUCING STOKE CITY



A WOMEN'S TEAM REPRESENTING STOKE CITY WAS FORMED IN 2001, STARTING IN THE WEST MIDLANDS LEAGUE DIVISION 1.

After gaining promotion to the West Midland Premier Division, they consolidated their position and began entering the Staffordshire County Ladies Challenge Cup.

It was in that competition that the Potters won their first ever trophy, beating Stafford Town Ladies to win it in 2007.

That sparked further success as promotion to the Midland Women's Combination was secured in 2009 as the team finished as

champions and, four years later, the Potters won a treble.

Stoke have been in the third tier of English football since 2009 and were renamed Stoke City Women at the start of 2021/22, marking the beginning of a new era.

At the start of last season, the Club's owners announced a significant increase in funding for the team meaning they would become semi-professional.

Marie Hourihan took over the reins as their first full-time head coach at the same time, replacing Lou Roberts who is now Burnley's first team coach.

Prior to stepping into coaching, Hourihan played at the highest

level of domestic women's football with Chelsea, Manchester City and Birmingham City.

She won the Women's Super League and Women's FA Cup and represented Republic of Ireland on 24 occasions.

Stoke come into this game in a rich vein of form of their own, winning their last five in all competitions.

The Potters beat Derby County 4-1 earlier this week, with striker Delphi Cole at the double including one from the penalty spot.

Olivia Cook and former Claret Mille Ravening were also on target at Wellbeing Park in a result that



takes Hourihan's side's points tally to 34 from 15 matches.

That leaves them 4th in the table and three points behind Burnley, although the Staffordshire-based side have played one match more.

The reverse league fixture took place at Clayton Wood Training Ground at the start of September, and the Clarets were 5-1 winners on a productive day.

A Laura Elford brace was a key part of that success, with further goals coming from Charley Docherty, Anna Grey and Aimee Kelly.

There are several familiar faces within the Potters squad, with Ravening, Lauren Bracewell, Dom Cooper, Evie Priestley and Lucia Molinari all having played for Burnley in the past.

Have you always played in your current position, or have you played elsewhere across the pitch?

When I was little I'd play half a game in goal and the other

half up front with one of my good friends who I'm still close to today.

I started academy football as a centre forward and later played on the wing, before moving back centrally.

If you had to name a stand-out moment from your career so far, what would it be?

Representing my country with the U23s – we won something called the Nordic tournament and I celebrated my 21st birthday while we were there.

I scored a few goals against teams like the USA, Norway and Sweden too.

You always remember your debut as well, and I remember coming on as a substitute for Liverpool in the Women's Super League.



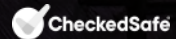
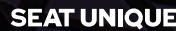
