Assembly Instructions

TOOLS REQUIRED BUT NOT INCLUDED:

Phillips head screwdriver, Drill, Hammer, Pencil

WARNINGS:

Do not throw away packing materials and carton until after assembly. Ensure all parts are present prior to assembly.

Contact customer service immediately if parts are missing.

Assemble all parts on a clean smooth surface.

CARE INSTRUCTIONS:

Avoid direct exposure to sunlight.

Do not place over heat or air conditioning vents.


Adjust levelers so that the furniture sits flat on uneven floors.

Blot spills with a clean white cloth, do not rub.

Do not use harsh chemicals.

Before cleaning any part test a small spot in a hidden area.

You may need to re-tighten all bolts after initial use.



PARTS INCLUDED:



A) Paper Holder (7 x 5 x 4.9") x 1 or (17.8 x 12.7 x 12.4 cm)



B) Plastic Anchor (D 0.35 x 1.38") x 2 or (D 9 x 35 mm)



C) Screw (D 0.27 x 1.38") x 2 or (D 7 x 35 mm)




STEP 1

Determine the position for the Toilet Paper Shelf (A). Ensure it is level and mark the location of the mounting holes in the Toilet Paper Shelf (A) on the wall (see dimensions below).




Wood or Stud installation:

Place the Toilet Paper Shelf (A) on the wall aligning the holes in the Holder with the marks on the wall. Insert the screws (C) through the Toilet Paper Shelf (A) into the wall. Tighten the screws (C) with a Phillips head screwdriver, one at a time. Do not over-tighten.



Drywall installation:

Insert anchors (B) into the wall at the marked locations with a drill and hammer (not included). Place the Toilet Paper Shelf (A) on the wall aligning the holes in the holder with the plastic anchors (B) in the wall. Insert screws (C) through Toilet Paper Shelf (A) and into the plastic anchors (B), then tighten with a Phillips head screwdriver, one at a time. Do not over-tighten.



The included hardware is intended for attachment to drywall or wooden studs within walls, contact your local hardware store to find the correct anchor for alternative wall-types such as stone or brick.
