How AnyQuestions works

Students visit the AnyQuestions website and chat with a real librarian about their schoolwork questions. The service:

- is staffed by friendly Aotearoa New Zealand librarians and supported by the Ministry of Education
- supports all areas and levels of *The New Zealand Curriculum*
- is open 10am to 3pm weekdays.
