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
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
## Your phone

## 1.1 Keys and connectors











## Menu key

- Touch: display menu options. On the Home screen, touch to access Wallpapers, Widgets and Settings.
- Touch & hold: this shows you images of your most recently-used apps. Touch an image to open the associated app, or swipe it left or right to remove it from the list.



## → Home key

- While on any app or screen, touch the **Home** key to return to the main Home screen.
- Touch & hold this key to access Google Now & Voice Search.



## Back key

 Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialogue box, options menu, the Notification panel, etc.

#### Power key

- Press: activate the lock screen/wake up the screen.
- Press and hold: show the pop-up menu to select from Power off, Restart, Airplane mode, and icons for ringing modes.
- Press and hold: power on.
- Press and hold the Power key and the Volume down key to capture a screenshot.

## Volume keys

- During a call, they adjust the earpiece or headset volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, they adjust the media volume.
- In general mode, they adjust the ringtone volume.
- Mute the ringtone of an incoming call.
- In Camera mode, pressing either volume key captures a photo.

## 1.2 Getting started

### 1.2.1 Set-up


Removing or installing the back cover



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#### Inserting or removing the SIM card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. Please power off your phone before inserting or removing the SIM card.



Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the SIM card, press and slide it out.



Your phone only supports mini-SIM cards. Do not attempt to insert other SIM card types, like micro-SIMs or nano-SIMs, otherwise this may cause damage to your phone.

#### Installing or removing the battery

Please power off your phone before removing the battery.



- Insert the battery and click it into place, then close the cover.
- Unclip the cover, then remove the battery.

#### Installing the microSD card



First remove the battery. Slide the microSD holder to the left to unlock it, then lift it up. Place the microSD card in the space provided, with the gold contacts facing down. Then fold the microSD holder down and slide it to the right until it locks.

## Charging the battery



To charge the battery, connect the charger to your phone and mains socket. You can also charge your phone via a USB cable.



To reduce energy wastage, disconnect your charger from the plug when the battery is fully charged.

To reduce your phone's power consumption, switch off Wi-Fi, Bluetooth or apps running in the background when not needed. In Settings you can also lower the brightness of the screen, and shorten the length of time before the screen goes to sleep.

## 1.2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on. It will take a few seconds before the screen lights up. Unlock your phone (Slide, PIN, password or pattern) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen will be displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your phone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

## Set up your phone for the first time

The first time you power on the phone you will be asked to set the following options: language, mobile data, Google account, date & time, etc.

- 1 Select the phone's language, then touch **Start**.
- 2 Select Mobile Data, then touch Next.
- 3 Setup Google account: Touch Setup now. If you have a Google Account, touch Existing to sign in, then enter your user name and password. If you forget your password, you can go to http://www.google.com/ to retrieve it. If you don't own a Google Account, you are prompted to create one by touching New.
- 4 Touch **Next** to go to **Date & Time**, to set your date and time zone (you can also choose Automatic time zone), then touch **Finish** to confirm.

If you power on your phone with no SIM card inserted you will still be able to connect to a Wi-Fi network to sign into your Google account and to use some features.

## 1.2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the Power key from the Home screen until the Phone options appear, then select Power off.

#### 1.3 Home screen

You can bring all your favourite items (apps, shortcuts, folders and widgets) to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the Home key to switch to the Home screen.

#### Status bar

· Status/Notification indicators

- · Touch and drag down to open the Notification panel
- Google Search bar
- Touch a to enter text search screen
- Touch b to enter voice search screen Slide left or right to view other panels on the Home screen



## Favourite tray apps

- Touch to enter the app
- Touch and hold to move or change apps
- Application tab
- Touch to open All apps

The Home screen extends on the right side of the screen to allow more space for adding apps, shortcuts, etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view of the Home screen. The white spot in the lower part of the screen indicates which screen you are viewing.

## 1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

# Touch 8

To access an app, touch it with your finger.

## Touch and hold



Touch and hold the Home screen to access the available options for setting the wallpaper.

# Drag »

Touch and hold an item to be able to drag it to another location.

## Slide/Swipe



Slide the screen to scroll up and down lists, screens of apps, images, web pages, etc.

# Flick

Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.

# Pinch/Spread

Place your fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.

# Rotate

Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways.

#### 1.3.2 Status bar

From status bar, you can view both phone status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side)


#### Notification panel

Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel. Touch and drag up to close it. From the Notification panel, you can open items and other reminders indicated by notification icons or view wireless service information.



Touch a notification and slide it sideways to delete it.

Touch the icon \_\_ to clear all event—based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).



#### 1.3.3 Search bar

The phone provides a Search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the phone or the web.



## a Search by text

- Touch Search bar from the Home screen.
- Enter the text/phrase you want to search for.
- $\bullet$  Touch  $\begin{tabular}{l} \end{tabular}$  on the keyboard if you want to search on the web.

## **b** Search by voice

- Touch U from Search bar to display a dialogue screen.
- Speak the word/phrase you want to search for. A list of search results will display for you to select from.

#### 1.3.4 Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock your phone screen with a variety of patterns, PIN or password, etc. through Settings > Security > Screen lock.

To create a screen unlock pattern (Follow onscreen instructions)

- Drag down the Notification panel and touch and then the Settings icon to access Settings, then touch Security > Screen lock > Pattern.
- Draw your own pattern.



## To create a screen unlock PIN/Password

- Touch Settings > Security > Screen lock > PIN or Password.
- Set your PIN or password.

## To lock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to lock the screen.

## To unlock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, draw the unlock pattern you have created or enter PIN or password to unlock the screen.

If you have chosen **Slide** as the screen lock, touch and drag the icon a right to unlock the screen.



## 1.3.5 Personalise your Home screen

## Add an app or widget

Touch the Application tab (31) or Menu key, then touch and hold the app or widget to activate the Move mode, and drag the item to any Home screen.

## Move an app or widget

Touch and hold the item to be repositioned to activate the Move mode, drag the item to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favourite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

## Remove an app or widget

Touch and hold the item to be removed to activate the Move mode, drag the item up to the top of the **Remove** icon, and release after the item turns red.

## Create folders

To make it easier to organise apps and shortcuts on the Home screen and the Favourite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

#### Wallpaper customisation

Touch and hold an empty area on the Home screen or go to **Settings > Display > Wallpaper** to customise your wallpaper.

## 1.3.6 Application tab

Touch ::: from the Home screen to show a list of all your apps.

To return to the Home screen, touch the **Home** key.

## 1.3.7 Volume adjustment

You can set the ringer, media and phone ringtone volume by pressing the **Volume up/down** key or go to **Settings > Sound**.

## 1.4 Widgets list

The list contains all pre-installed and newly installed widgets.

To open the list, touch the **Menu** key and then Widgets. To return to the Home screen, touch the **Home** key or the **Back** key.

Touch the icon to access the Play Store.

# 2 Text input

## 2.1 Using the onscreen keyboard

## Onscreen keyboard settings

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, select **Settings > Language & input**, then touch the Settings icon on the right of **Google Keyboard**.

## Adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation

Turn the phone sideways or upright to adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation. You can also adjust it by changing the settings (qo to Settings > Display > Auto rotate screen).

## 2.1.1 Google Keyboard



Touch to switch between the symbol and numeric keyboards

## 2.2 Text editing

You can edit the text you have entered.

- Touch and hold or double-tap on the text you would like to edit.
- Drag the end points to change the highlighted selection.
- The following options will show: Select all **!!!** , Cut **| ?** , Copy **|** and **Paste | !!** .

Touch the icon \( \sqrt{to confirm.} \)

#### You can also insert new text

- Touch where you want to type, or touch and hold a blank space, the cursor will blink and the tab will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have selected any text, touch the tab to show PASTE icon which allows you to paste any text you have previously copied.



# 3 Phone call, Call log & Contacts

## 3.1 Phone call



## 3.1.1 Placing a call

You can easily make a call using **Phone.** Touch the Application tab from the Home screen and select **Phone** 



Enter the number you want from the dialpad directly or select a contact from **Contacts** or **History** by sliding or touching tabs, then touch to place the call.

The number you entered can be saved to Contacts by touching  $\equiv$  key and selecting Add to Contacts.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching  $\overleftarrow{\boxtimes}.$ 

To hang up a call, touch .

## International call

To dial an international call, touch and hold to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and finally touch **Call**.

## **Emergency call**

If your phone has network coverage, dial emergency number and touch to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.

## 3.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call, touch 📞 .

- Slide the icon right to answer the call;
- Slide the icon left to reject the call;
- Slide the icon up to reject the call by sending a preset message.

To mute incoming calls, press the **Volume up/down** key or turn the phone face down if **Turn over to mute** is active (to turn this on, go to **Settings > Gestures > Turn over to mute**).

## 3.1.3 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

To access your voicemail, touch and hold on **Phone** tab.

To set your voicemail number, touch  $\equiv$  key and touch Settings > Voice call > Voicemail.


If you receive a voicemail, a voicemail icon **QO** appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel, touch **New voicemail**.

## 3.1.4 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the **Volume up/down** key.



Touch to hold the current call. Touch this icon again to retrieve the call.



Touch to end the current call.

Touch to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.

Touch to activate the speaker during the current call.

Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.

Touch and select **Start recording** to record.



To avoid misoperation on touchscreen during a call, screen will be locked automatically when you put the cellphone close to your ear; and it will be unlocked when the cellphone is taken away from your ear.

## 3.1.5 Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

#### Conference calls (1)

You can set up a conference call.

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Enter the phone number of the person you want to add to conference and touch ... You can also add participants from People or History.
- Touch icon 1 to start a conference call.
- During a conference call, touch to drop a participant or to talk privately to one of the participants. Touch to drop the participant from the conference, touch to talk privately to the participant and hold on other participants.
- Touch to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

<sup>(1)</sup> Depending on your network operator.

## 3.1.6 Call settings

Touch \equiv key and select **Settings** from Dial screen, the following options are available:

#### Voice call

## Voicemail

Service Opens a dialogue box where you can select your carrier's voicemail service or

another service.

## Voicemail settings

If you are using your carrier's voicemail service, this opens a dialogue box where you can enter the phone number to use for listening to and managing your voicemail You can enter a comma () to insert a pause into the number — for example, to add a password after the phone number.

## Call forwarding

Touch to configure how your calls are always forwarded or when you are busy, unanswered or unreachable.

#### Call barring

You can activate or deactivate the call barring for outgoing and incoming calls. The various options are:

**All outgoing calls** All outgoing calls are barred.

International outgoing calls Outgoing international calls are barred.

International except home

Outgoing international calls except those to your country of subscription

are barred.

All incoming calls All incoming calls are barred.

Incoming calls in Incoming calls are barred when you are

abroad

## Additional settings

Caller ID

Opens a dialogue box where you can set whether your phone number is

displayed when making calls.

Call waiting

Mark the check box to notify you of a

new incoming call.

Call waiting status

Check the call waiting status of your phone.

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#### Other settings

## · Fixed dialing numbers

Fixed Dialing Number (FDN) is a service mode of SIM, where outgoing calls are restricted to a set of phone numbers. These numbers are added to the FDN list. The most common practical application of FDN is for parents to restrict the phone numbers which their children can dial.

For security reasons, you'll be prompted to enable FDN by entering SIM PIN2 which is usually acquired from your service provider or SIM maker.

## · Minute reminder

Mark the check box to enable minute reminder at 50s of every minute during a call.

#### Turn over to mute

Mark the check box to enable mute incoming call by turning phone over.

## • Dual mic noise reduction

Mark the checkbox to turn on dual mic for noise reduction.

## Quick responses

Touch to edit quick responses which will be used when you reject a call with messages.

#### · International dialing assist

Mark the checkbox to activate.

#### Hearing aids

Mark the checkbox to turn on hearing aid compatibility.

## 3.2 View your call history

You can view your call history by touching ① from the Dial screen to view call history in categories of Incoming calls, Outgoing calls, and Missed calls.

Touch a contact or number to view information or further operations.

You can view detailed information of a call, launch a new call or send messages to a contact or number, or add numbers to **People** (only available for unsaved phone numbers), etc.

Touch the photo 👤 to open the Quick Contact panel.

## 3.3 People




You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronise these with your Gmail contacts or other apps on the web or on your phone.



When using People for the first time you are asked to add new contacts, import contacts from your SIM card or synchronise contacts from other app accounts to your phone.

## 3.3.1 View your contacts

To access **People** app, touch the Application tab on the Home screen, then select **People**.



Touch key to display contacts list option menu.

Following actions are enabled:

• Delete contact Select and delete unwanted contacts.

 Contacts to display Choose contacts to display.

• Import/Export

Import or export contacts between phone, SIM card, and microSD card, or share contacts

Accounts

Manage the synchronisation settings for different accounts.

Settings

Access to contact display settings.

Share visible contacts

Share contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Email. SMS. etc.

## 3.3.2 Managing contact groups

The contact group helps you to improve the organisation of your contacts. You can add, remove and view groups in the **Contact group** screen.

Touch the icon  $\triangleq$  to view local groups. To create a new group, touch the icon  $\triangleq$ , enter the new name and touch **DONE** to confirm. If you have added accounts to your phone, touch the icon  $\triangleq$  to view groups in accounts.

## 3.3.3 Adding a contact



If you want to add more information, touch **Add another field** to add a new category.

When finished, touch **DONE** to save.

To exit without saving, you can touch  $\equiv$  key and then **Discard**.

#### Add to/remove from Favourites

To add a contact to favourites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch  $\frac{1}{2}$  to add the contact to favourites.

To remove a contact from favourites, touch  $\stackrel{\bullet}{\text{m}}$  on contact details screen.



Only phone and account contacts can be added to favourites.

## 3.3.4 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch  $\equiv$  key in the contact details screen, then touch **Edit.** When finished, touch **DONE**.

## Change a contact's default phone number

The default phone number (the number which has priority when making a call or sending a message) will always be displayed under the contact name.

To change the default phone number, touch and hold the number you want to set as the default number from the contact's details screen, then select **Set default**. A  $\sqrt{}$  appears after the number.

This choice is only available when the contact has more than one number

#### Delete a contact

To delete a contact, touch **key** and touch **Delete** from contact (details) screen.

On contacts list screen, touch key and then **Delete** contact, select the contact(s) you want to remove and touch **OK** to confirm. Touch **Select all** and then to select all contacts, touch again to deselect.



The contact you have deleted will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronise your phone.

## 3.3.5 Communicating with your contacts

From contact details screen, you can communicate with your contacts by making a call or exchanging messages.

To launch a call, touch the phone number.

To send a message, touch the icon on the right side of the number.

#### Use quick contact for Android

Touch a contact's picture to open Quick Contact for Android, then you can touch the number or the icon for the way you want to connect.



The icons available on Quick Contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications/accounts on your phone.

## 3.3.6 Importing, exporting and sharing contacts

From the Contacts screen, touch \( \subseteq \text{key} \) to open the options menu, touch \( \subseteq \text{Import/Export}, \) then select to import/export contacts from/to your SIM card, Phone, microSD card, Phone storage, Accounts, etc.

To import/export a single contact from/to your SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card(s), select the contact you want to import/export, and touch **OK** to confirm.

To import/export all contacts from/to your SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card(s), touch **Select all** and touch **OK** to confirm.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc. To do this, touch a contact you want to share, touch key and **Share** from contact details screen, then select the app to perform this action.

## 3.3.7 Displaying contacts

You can configure which group of contacts, for each account, you want to display in the Contacts list. Touch key and then Contacts to display from contacts list screen, then you can choose contacts to display.

Touch \( \equiv \) key and then **Settings**, you can **Sort list by** Given name or Family name, as well as **View contact names as** Given name first or Family name first.

## 3.3.8 Joining/Discarding contacts

To avoid duplication, you can add any new contact information to existing contacts in a single action.

Touch the contact which you want to add information to, touch  $\equiv$  key and then **Edit**, then touch  $\equiv$  key in edit screen and touch **Join**.

At this time, you are required to select the contact whose information you want to join with the first contact. The information from the second contact is added to the first one, and the second contact will no longer be displayed in the Contacts list.

To separate contact information, touch the contact whose information you want to separate, touch  $\equiv$  key and then **Edit**, then touch  $\equiv$  key in edit screen and touch **Separate**, touch **OK** to confirm.

## 3.3.9 Synchronising contacts in multiple accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronised from multiple accounts, depending on the apps installed on your phone.

To add an account, touch **account** on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**, then touch **Add account**.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Corporate, etc.

As with other account set-ups, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account and all associated information from the phone. Open the **Settings** screen, touch the account you want to delete, touch **key** and then select **Remove** account, then confirm.

#### Sync

You can synchronise an account on **Accounts** screen, touch an account in the list, then touch **key** and select **Sync now** 

## 4 Messaging & Email

## 4.1 Messaging



Your phone can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS messages.

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then select  ${\bf Messaging}.$ 



All messages you receive or send out can be saved in your phone memory or SIM card. To view SMS messages stored on your SIM card, touch ≡ key from Messaging screen, then touch Settings > Text messages (SMS) > Manage SIM messages.

## 4.1.1 Create a new message

On the message list screen, touch the new message icon =, to write new text/multimedia messages.



 Touch to view the whole message thread

 Touch & hold message threads to delete messages or to add shortcut



## Sending a text message

Enter the mobile phone number of the recipient on the Type name or number bar or touch to add recipients, then touch the Enter message bar to enter the text of the message. When you've finished, touch to send the text message.



An SMS of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. Specific letters (like accents, for example) will also increase the size of the SMS, so this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

## Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides and audio to other compatible phones and email addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or Subject or email addresses are added.

To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the Type name or number bar, touch Enter message bar to enter the text of the message, touch key to open the option menu, touch Add subject to insert a subject, and touch to attach picture, video, audio and so on.

When finished, touch to send the multimedia message.

#### Attach options:

Audio

Pictures Access Gallery or File manager to select a picture as attachment.

Access Camera to capture a new picture

Access music from Ringtone or Audio.

• Capture picture Access Camera to capture a new picture for attaching.

Videos Access Gallery or File manager to select a video as attachment.

 Capture video Access Camcorder to record a new video for attaching.

• Record audio Access Sound Recorder to record a new record.

• Slideshow Enter Edit slide show screen, touch Add slide to create a new slide, and touch currently existing slide to edit it (see following picture). Touch ≡ to get more options, like slide duration setting, music

Contact Access People to select one or more contact(s) to attach.

adding, etc.

Calendar Access Calendar to select one or more event(s) to attach.



## 4.1.2 Manage messages

When a new message comes, an icon will appear on status bar as notification. Drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, touch the new message to open it. You can also access **Messaging** and touch the new message to open it.

Messages are displayed in conversational order.

To reply to a message, touch the current message to enter message-composing screen, enter the text, then touch >.

Touch and hold a message in message details screen, the following options will be available:

 Copy
 This option is only available for SMS. Touch to copy current message content and past it to Enter message bar of the new message you are going to compose.

• Forward Touch to forward the message to another recipient.

The first time you set up your phone, you can select to use an existing Gmail account or to create a new Email account.

## 4.2.1 Gmail



As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. Gmail on your phone can be automatically synchronised with your Gmail account on the web. Unlike other kinds of email account, each message and its replies in Gmail are grouped in your inbox as a single conversation; all emails are organised by labels instead of folders

## To access Gmail

From the Home screen, touch the Application tab to enter the applications list, then touch Gmail.

## To create and send emails

- 1 Touch from Inbox screen.
- 2 Enter recipient(s)'s email address in To field.
- 3 If necessary, touch key and touch Add Cc/Bcc to add a copy or a blind copy to the message.
- 4 Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- 5 Touch key and select Attach file to add an attachment.
- 6 Finally, touch the icon > to send.
- 7 If you do not want to send the mail out right away, you can touch key and then Save draft or touch the Back key to save a copy. To view the draft, touch your account name to display all labels, then select Drafts.

If you do not want to send or save the mail, you can touch key and then touch **Discard**.

To add a signature to emails, touch the account of inbox and then touch **Settings** from inbox screen, choose an account, then touch **Signature**.

## To receive and read your emails

When a new email arrives, you will be notified by a ringtone or vibration, and an icon will appear on Status bar.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to display the Notification panel, touch the new email to view it. Or you can also access the Gmail Inbox label and touch the new mail to read it.

You can search for an email by sender, recipient, subject, etc.

- Touch the icon Q from Inbox screen.
- Enter the keyword you want to search for in the searching box and touch an

#### 4.2.2 Email



Besides your Gmail account, you can also set up external email accounts on your phone.

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Email**.

An email wizard will guide you through the steps to set up an email account.

- 1 Enter the email address and password of the account you want to set up.
- 2 Touch Next. If the account you entered is not provided by your service provider in the phone, you will go to the email account settings screen to enter settings manually. Or you can touch Manual setup to directly enter the incoming and outgoing settings for the email account you are setting up.
- 3 Enter the account name and display name in account setup.
- 4 To add another email account, you can touch key and Settings. Touch ADD ACCOUNT on the right of the title to create a new account.

## To create and send emails

- 1 Touch the icon \_\_\_\_ on Inbox screen.
- 2 Enter recipient(s) email address(es) in the To field.
- 3 If necessary, touch \( \overline{\overline{\text{me}}}\) key and touch \( \overline{\text{Add Cc/Bcc}}\) to add a copy or a blind copy to other recipients.
- 4 Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- 5 Touch key, then touch Attach file to add an attachment.
- 6 Finally, touch > to send.
- 7 If you do not want to send the mail right away, you can touch **key** and **Save draft** or touch the **Back** key to save a copy.

# 5 Calendar, Alarm clock & Calculator

## 5.1 Calendar




Use Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Calendar**.

#### 5.1.1 Multimode view

You can display the Calendar in daily, weekly, monthly, or agenda view.

To change your Calendar view, touch the date title to open a drop-down menu for your options. Touch the icon to Today's view.



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#### 5.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch the icon + to access new event edit screen.
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select All day.
- When finished, touch **DONE** from the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from Day, Week view screen, touch and hold an empty spot or an event to open Option menu, then touch **New event** to enter the event details screen of the time you have previously selected. Or you can also touch an empty spot till it turns blue, then tap again to enter new event editing screen.

#### 5.1.3 To delete or edit an event

To share, delete or edit an event, touch the event to enter details screen, touch the icon of the share the event to other people by Bluetooth, Email and messaging, etc., touch the icon of to edit the event, and touch the icon of to delete.

#### 5.1.4 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon will appear on Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Touch and drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, touch event name to view Calendar notification list.

Touch Snooze to turn off all event reminders for 5 minutes.

Touch **Back** key to keep the reminders pending in the status bar and the Notification panel.

Important options by touching key from Calendar main screen:

Refresh To refresh the calendar.

Search To search in the calendar.

• Calendars to To show or hide the synchronised display calendars.

• **Go to** Select to go to specific date.

• **Settings** To set a series of Calendar settings.

## 5.2 Clock

Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Clock**.

Touch to add or set an alarm.

## 5.2.1 To set an alarm

From **Time** screen, touch to enter **Alarms** screen, touch to add a new alarm. Following options will show:

• Time Touch numbers to set the time for your alarm.

• Label Touch to set a name for the alarm.

• **REPEAT** Touch to select days you want alarm

to work.

• OCEAN Touch to select an alarm ringtone.

VIBRATE Select to activate vibration.

Touch and hold an already existing alarm and touch  $\stackrel{*}{=}$  to delete the selected alarm.

## 5.2.2 To adjust alarm settings

Touch **key** from **Alarms** screen. The following options will be available under **Settings**:

#### CLOCK

• Style Touch to set Analog or Digital style.

Automatic Touch to set home clock while travelling home clock
 outside.

• **Home time** Touch to set home time zone.

#### **ALARMS**

• Silence after Touch to set time silence.

• Snooze length Touch to choose length of snooze.

Alarm volume Touch to set alarm volume.

 Volume buttons Touch to choose Snooze, Dismiss or Do nothing as volume buttons.

• Turn over to Touch to choose Snooze or Stop as turn activate over behaviour.

## 5.3 Calculator



With Calculator, you can solve many mathematical problems.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Calculator**.

There are two panels available: Basic panel and Advanced panel.

To switch between panels, select one of the following two ways:

- Touch and drag the basic screen to the left to open the Advanced panel.



## 6 Getting connected

Your phone can connect to the Internet using either GPRS/EDGE/3G or Wi-Fi.

## 6.1 Connecting to the Internet

#### 6.1.1 GPRS/EDGE/3G

The first time you turn on your phone with the SIM card inserted, it will automatically configure a mobile network service: GPRS, EDGE or 3G. If the network is not connected, you can turn on **Mobile data** on **Settings > Data usage**.

To check the network connection you are using, touch the Application tab on the Home screen, then touch Settings > More... > Mobile networks > Access Point Names or Network operators.

## To create a new access point

A new GPRS/EDGE/3G network connection can be added to your phone with the following steps:

- 1 Touch on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > Mobile networks > Access Point Names.

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- 3 Then touch key and select New APN.
- 4 Enter the required APN information.
- 5 When finished, touch **key** and **Save**.

#### To activate/deactivate Data roaming

When roaming, you can decide to connect/disconnect to a data service.

- 1 Touch a on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > Mobile networks.
- 3 Mark/Unmark the checkbox to activate or deactivate data roaming.
- 4 When Data roaming is deactivated, you can still perform data exchange with a Wi-Fi connection (refer to "6.1.2 Wi-Fi").

## 6.1.2 Wi-Fi

You can connect to the Internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on the phone even without a SIM card inserted.

#### To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- 1 Touch to on the Quick setting bar to go to Settings.
- 2 Touch the switch beside Wi-Fi to turn on/off Wi-Fi.
- 3 Touch Wi-Fi: detailed information of all detected Wi-Fi networks is displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- 4 Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (contact network operator for details). When you're finished, touch **Connect**.

#### To activate notification when a new network is detected

When Wi-Fi is on and the network notification is activated, the Wi-Fi icon will appear on the status bar whenever the phone detects an available wireless network within range. The following steps activate the notification function when Wi-Fi is on:

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Wi-Fi, then key and select Advanced.
- 3 Mark/Unmark the Network notification checkbox to activate/deactivate this function.

#### To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- 1 Touch a on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Wi-Fi, and then touch +.
- 3 Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- 4 Touch Save.

When successfully connected, your phone will be connected automatically the next time you are within range of this network.

#### To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- 1 Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- 2 In the Wi-Fi screen, touch & hold the name of the saved network.
- 3 Touch Forget network in the dialogue that opens.


## 6.2 Browser

Using the Browser you can enjoy surfing the Web.

To get onto the Web, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Browser**.

## To go to a web page

On Browser screen, touch the URL box at the top, enter the address of the web page, then touch  $\hfill \omega$  to confirm.



## To set homepage

- 1 Touch \(\overline{\ov
- $\,2\,$  Choose a page or most visited website as your homepage.
- 3 If you choose **Other**, enter the URL of the website you want to set as your homepage, touch **OK** to confirm.

## 6.2.1 Viewing web pages

When opening a website, you can navigate on web pages by sliding your finger on the screen in any direction to locate the information you want to view.

## To find text on a web page

- 1 Touch  $\equiv$  key from web page screen, then touch **Find on** page.
- 2 Enter the text or phrase you want to find.
- 3 The first word with matching characters will be highlighted on the screen, and subsequent matches will be boxed.
- 4 Touch the up or down arrow to switch to the previous or next matching items.
- 5 When finished, you can touch 
  or the Back key to close the search har

## To open new window/switch between windows

Multiple windows can be opened at the same time for your convenience.

- 1 Touch to open all windows' thumbnails.
- 2 Slide up and down to view all windows, touch one to view it.
- 3 Touch to open a new window.
- 4 To close a window, touch X on the window you want to close or slide it sideways.

#### Other options:

• **Refresh** To refresh the current page.

• **Stop** To stop opening the current page.

• Home page To get back to the homepage you set.

• Save to To add the current website page as bookmarks bookmark

Close To close all tabs and exit.

• Share page To share the current page with your friends via various ways, like Message, Email, Bluetooth,

etc.

• Find on page To input contents you want to find on the

current page.

Request To enable/disable computer version desktop site websites.

Bookmarks/ To see the bookmarks and browsing history.

• **Settings** To access a series of Browser settings.

## 6.2.2 Manage links, history, downloads

• **Link** Touch the link to open the web page.

• **Phone** Touch to call the phone number.

## To view Browser history

• Touch key from Browser screen.

• Touch **Bookmarks/History**.

• Touch **History** tab to view browser history.

## To download a web application/view your downloads

Before downloading a web application, you need to enable your phone to install web applications (touch the Application tab from the Home screen, touch **Settings > Security**, mark checkbox of **Unknown sources**, finally touch **OK** to confirm).

To download a item, touch the item or the link you want to download.

To cancel a download, touch the downloaded item from the Notification panel, touch and hold the item to be deleted, and touch  $\stackrel{*}{=}$  to confirm.

To view items you have downloaded, touch the Application tab, then touch **DOWNLOADED**.

#### Manage bookmarks

## To bookmark a web page

- Open the web page you want to bookmark.
- Touch = key and touch Save to bookmarks, or from the History screen, touch the star beside the URL.
- Enter the name and the location if needed and touch OK to confirm.

## To open a bookmark

- Touch == key and touch Bookmarks/History, or touch the icon to enter the Bookmarks screen.
- Touch the bookmark you want to open.
- You can also touch and hold to display the options screen, then touch Open or Open in new window.

Touch and hold a bookmark in the bookmark list to view additional options:

- Edit bookmark To edit the bookmark.
- Share link To share the bookmark.
- Copy link URL To copy the bookmark link.
- **Delete** To delete the bookmark link.

A series of settings are available for your adjustment. To access Browser settings, touch key from Browser screen, and touch **Settings**.

## 6.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To access this function, touch to access this function, touch to Settings, then touch Bluetooth, your device and other available ones will show on the screen.

#### To turn on Bluetooth

- 1 Touch on Quick setting bar to get to Settings.
- 2 Touch \_\_\_\_ to activate/deactivate this function.

To make your phone more recognisable, you can change your phone name which is visible to others.

- 1 Touch a on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Bluetooth.
- 3 Touch key and select Rename phone.
- 4 Enter a name, and touch Rename to confirm.

#### To make device visible

- 1 Touch on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Bluetooth.
- 3 Touch your device to make it visible or invisible.
- 4 Touch key and select **Visibility timeout** to select the visible time.

## To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- 1 Touch on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Bluetooth.
- 3 Touch SEARCH FOR DEVICES.
- 4 Touch a Bluetooth device you want to be paired with in the list.
- 5 A dialogue will popup, touch Pair to confirm.
- 6 If the pairing is successful, your phone connects to the device.

## To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- 1 Touch the device name you want to unpair.
- 2 Touch **Unpair** to confirm.

## 6.4 Connecting to a computer via USB

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your phone and computer.

## To connect/disconnect your phone to/from the computer:

Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.

If you want to change the USB connection type, open the Notifications panel and touch  $\, \Psi \, .$ 

# To locate data you have transferred or downloaded in the internal storage:

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen to open the apps list.
- 2 Touch File Manager.

All data you have downloaded is stored in **File Manager**, where you can view media files (videos, photos, music and others), rename files, install apps onto your phone, etc.

#### To format a microSD card

- 1 Touch to on Quick setting bar to get to Settings.
- 2 Touch Storage.
- 3 Touch Format SD card, a popup message appears to warn you that formatting the miscroSD card will erase its contents.
- 4 Touch Format SD card to confirm.

# 6.5 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer via a USB cable (USB tethering) or with up to eight devices at once by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

## To turn on USB tethering or Portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to go to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 3 Mark the checkbox of USB tethering or turn on Wi-Fi hotspot to activate this function.



Sharing data may incur additional charges from your network operator. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas.

#### To share your phone's data connection via USB

Use the USB cable that along with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer.

- 1 Drag down the Notification panel and touch **!** then the Settings icon **!** to access **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 3 Mark\unmark the checkbox of USB tethering to activate/ deactivate this function.

# To share your phone's data connection as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- 1 Drag down the Notification panel and touch then the Settings icon to access Settings.
- 2 Touch More... > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 3 Touch the switch beside **Wi-Fi hotspot** to activate/ deactivate this function.

## To rename or secure your portable hotspot

When Portable Wi-Fi hotspot is activated, you could change the name of your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network

- 1 Drag down the Notification panel and touch the Settings icon to access Settings. Drag down the Notification panel and touch then the Settings icon to access Settings.
- 2 Touch More... > Tethering & portable hotspot > Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 3 Touch Set up Wi-Fi hotspot to change the network SSID or set your network security.
- 4 Touch Save.

## 6.6 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

#### To add a VPN

- 1 Touch a on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > VPN and then touch
- 3 In the screen that opens, follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- 4 Touch Save.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a lock screen pattern, PIN code or password for your phone.

#### To connect/disconnect to a VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- 1 Touch on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > VPN.
- 3 VPNs you have added are listed; touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- 4 In the dialogue that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch **Connect**.

To disconnect:

 Open the Notification panel and touch the resulting notification for VPN disconnection.

#### To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

- 1 Touch on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > VPN.
- 3 VPNs you have added are listed; touch & hold the VPN you want to edit.
- 4 Touch Edit profile.
- 5 After finished, touch Save.

To delete:

 Touch and hold the VPN you want to delete, in the dialogue that opens, touch **Delete profile**.

# 7 Google Play Store (1)



Google Play Store is an online software store, where you can download and install applications and games to your Android Powered Phone.

To open Google Play Store:

- Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Play Store**.
- For the first time you access Google Play Store, a screen with terms of service pops up for your attention, touch Accept to continue.

Touch the top left corner, then touch **HELP** to enter Google Play Shop help page for more information on this function.

## 8.1 Camera

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Your mobile phone is fitted with a Camera for taking photos and shooting videos.

Before using the Camera, please be sure to open the protective lens cover before use to avoid it affecting your picture quality.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen and then touch **Camera** 



## To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch icon to take the picture which will be automatically saved.

#### To shoot a video

First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, and touch icon to start recording. Touch to stop recording. Touch to save the video.

# Further operations when viewing a picture/video you have taken

- Touch the icon of Gmail, Bluetooth, Messaging, etc to share the photo or video you have taken.
- Slide right to access **Gallery**.

## 8.2 Gallery



Gallery acts as a media player for you to view photos and playback videos. In addition, a set of further operations to pictures and videos are available for your choice.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Gallery**.



Touch to select album, then choose several pictures (max 9) for further editing

- Touch to Switch to camera

\_Touch to select categories: Albums, Locations, Times

Touch the album to open it

Slide left or right to view more albums

#### To view a picture/play a video

Pictures and videos are displayed by albums in **Gallery**.



Touch to return to gallery's main screen


Slide left or right to view more pictures

- Touch the picture/video directly to view or play it.
- Slide left/right to view previous or next pictures/videos.

## Working with pictures

You can work with pictures by rotating or cropping them, sharing them with friends, setting them as contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Locate the picture you want to work on, touch the picture from full-screen picture view. Touch icon  $<\!\!<^\circ$  to share the picture, touch  $\stackrel{\scriptscriptstyle \leftarrow}{\equiv}$  icon above and confirm **OK** to delete the picture.



Touch from full-screen picture view to edit a picture.



**Edit** Touch to **Crop**, **Rotate** or **Sharpen** the picture.

Enhance Touch to open Color mixing and Smart fill light.

Touch to set effect of Lomo, Portrait, Fashion or Art.

Word Touch to edit words onto the picture.

Bokeh Touch to set Circle bokeh or Line bokeh.



After activating the crop mode, the cropping square appears in the middle of the picture. Select the portion to crop, touch of to confirm and save, touch icon to exit without saving.

#### **Batch operation**

Gallery provides a multi-select function, so that you can work with pictures/videos in batches.

Open the main Gallery window or an album, touch  $\equiv$  key and touch **Select album** to activate batch operation mode (you can also touch and hold one album/picture), then touch albums/pictures you want to work on. Touch  $\stackrel{\bullet}{\blacksquare}$  to delete. Touch  $\stackrel{\triangleleft}{\triangleleft}$  to share selected ones.

# 8.3 Play music



Using this menu, you can play music files stored on the microSD card in your phone. Music files can be downloaded from computer to microSD card using a USB cable.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Play Music**.

You will find four categories in which all songs are classified: **GENRES**, **ARTISTS**, **ALBUMS** and **SONGS**. Slide left and right to view all. Touch **Shuffle all** to shuffle all songs.

To activate your phone's positioning using Wi-Fi or mobile data connection network:

Touch • icon on the map to view **My Location**.

The map will then centre on a blue dot. Your actual position at the blue dot.



To move the map, drag the map with your finger.


To zoom in and out of a map, pinch or spread your fingers, or you can also zoom in by double-tapping a location on screen.

Just like bookmarking a web address on the Internet, you can star any position on the map for later use.



# 10.1 File Manager



To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **File Manager**.

**File Manager** works with both microSD card and phone storage.

**File Manager** displays all data stored on both microSD card and phone storage, including applications, media files; videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

When you download an application from PC to microSD card, you can locate the application on File Manager, then touch it to install it in your phone.

File Manager allows you to perform and be really efficient with the following common operations: create (sub) folder, open folder/file, view, rename, move, copy, delete, play, share, etc.

# 10.2 Sound Recorder



To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Sound Recorder**.

**Sound Recorder** allows you to record voice/sound for seconds/hours.


# 10.3 Radio



Your phone is equipped with a radio<sup>(1)</sup>. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you turn to stations that offer Visual Radio service.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Radio**.

Please insert a headset to improve the FM Radio reception quality.



#### Available options:

# 11.1 Wireless & networks

#### 11.1.1 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can now surf the Internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your phone to the wireless network.

For detailed instructions on using Wi-Fi, please refer to "6.1.2 Wi-Fi".

#### 11.1.2 Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) in a small range with another Bluetooth supported device (phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, etc.).

For more information on Bluetooth, please refer to "6.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices".

### 11.1.3 Data usage

To enable/disable mobile data by touching the switch

Mark the checkbox of **Set mobile data limit**, then you can drag the limit line and the warning line according to your limitation. Your mobile data connection will be disabled when the specified limit is reached. You can also choose a data usage cycle to view the statistics and related applications of used data by your phone.

Touch  $\equiv$  key, and you can view more settings related to your data usage.



Data usage is measured by your phone, and your carrier may count differently. Please consider using a conservative limit.

# 11.1.4 Airplane mode

Through More... > Airplane mode to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

You can also open Airplane mode by touching **AIRPLANE MODE** on Quick setting bar or in phone options when pressing **Power** key.

#### 11.1.5 VPN

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides mobile devices with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks. Mobile VPNs are used in environments where workers need to keep application sessions open at all times, throughout the working day, as the user connects via various wireless networks, encounters gaps in coverage, or suspend-and-resumes their devices to preserve battery life. A conventional VPN cannot survive such events because the network tunnel is disrupted, causing applications to disconnect, time out, fail, or even the computing device itself to crash.

For more information on VPN, please refer to "6.6 Connecting to virtual private networks".

# 11.1.6 Tethering & portable hotspot

This function allows you to share your phone's mobile data connection via USB or as a portable Wi-Fi access point (Please refer to "6.5 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection").

#### Data roaming

Mark the check box to connect to data services when roaming.

#### Preferred networks

Touch to view/edit/delete preferences.

#### Network mode

Touch to select network mode

You can select a network operator.

#### 11.1.8 USB Internet

Mark the checkbox to share Windows PC internet via USB cable.

- 3 Finish connection as instructed, then touch Done.

You can also touch some apps icons to deactivate their notifications in status bar.

# 11.2.5 Storage

Use these settings to monitor the total and available space on your phone and on your microSD card; to manage your microSD card.



If a warning message comes up saying that phone memory is limited, you are required to free up space by deleting some unwanted applications, downloaded files, etc.

# 11.2.6 Battery

In battery screen you can view the battery usage data since you last connected the phone to a power source. The screen also shows your battery status and how long it has been used since last charging. Touch one category, then you can learn its specific power consumption.

You can adjust power use via the screen brightness or screen timeout in Display screen.

# 11.2.7 Applications

You use the Applications settings to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their data and force them to stop, and to set whether you want to permit installation of applications that you obtain from web sites and emails.

Use your wireless network to pinpoint your location within an accuracy as close as several meters ("street level").

To protect your phone and personal data, download applications only from trusted sources, such as Android Market.

Touch to display the storage type.

Touch to display trusted CA certificates.

# 11.3.3 Language & input

Use the Language & input settings to select the language for the text on your phone and for configuring the onscreen keyboard. You can also configure voice input settings and the pointer speed.

#### Language

Touch to select the language and the region you want.

#### Spell checker

Mark the checkbox to enable the system to show suggested words.

#### Personal dictionary

Touch to open a list of the words you've added to the dictionary. Touch a word to edit or delete it. Touch the add button (+) to add a word.

#### Default

Touch to select a default input method. Touch the Settings icon on the right of selected input method, a series of settings are available for your selection.

# Google keyboard

The Google keyboard settings apply to the onscreen keyboard that is included with your phone. The correction and capitalisation features affect only the English version of the keyboard. Available options are as follows:

# Input languages

Touch to set input language.

# Auto-capitalisation

Mark the checkbox to have the onscreen keyboard automatically capitalise the first letter of the first word after a period, the first word in a text field, and each word in name fields.

Mark the checkbox to have the phone vibrate briefly each time you touch a key on the onscreen keyboard.

Mark the checkbox to play a brief sound each time you touch a key on the onscreen keyboard.

Mark the checkbox to popup the key that you touched.

Mark the checkbox to enable voice input.

Touch to Install or Delete the language dictionaries.

Mark the checkbox to block the offensive words.

Mark the checkbox to enable input a word by sliding through the letters.

Touch to choose a preferred text-to-speech engine, touch the Settings icon to show more choices for each engine.

#### Speech rate

Touch to open a dialogue where you can select how quickly you want the synthesiser to speak.

#### Listen to an example

Touch to play a brief sample of the speech synthesiser, using your current settings.

# Pointer speed

Touch to open a dialogue where you can change the pointer speed, touch **OK** to confirm.

# 11.3.4 Backup and reset

# Data backup

This phone enables you to back up your phone's settings and other app data to Google Servers, using your Google Account.

If you replace your phone, the settings and data you've backed up can be restored onto the new phone the first time you sign in with your Google Account.

To activate this function:

- 1 Touch on Quick setting bar to go to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Backup and reset > Back up my data.
- 3 Mark the checkbox.

If you've turned on this function, a wide variety of settings and data are backed up, including your Wi-Fi passwords, bookmarks, a list of the apps you've installed, the words you've added to the dictionary used by the onscreen keyboard, and most of the settings that you configure with the Settings app. If you turn this option off, it will stop backing up your settings, and any existing backups are deleted from Google Servers.

# Factory data reset

To activate a factory data reset:

- 1 Touch on Quick setting bar to go to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Backup and reset > Factory data reset.

# 3 Touch Reset phone > Erase everything.

Reset phone will erase all of your personal data from internal phone storage, including information about your Google Account, any other accounts, your system and app settings, and any downloaded apps. Resetting the phone does not erase any system updates you have downloaded. If you reset the phone in this way, you are prompted to re-enter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

If you're unable to turn your phone on, there is another alternative to perform a factory data reset by pressing the **Volume up** key and the **Power** key at same time under power off mode until the screen lights up.

#### 11.4 Accounts

Use the settings to add, remove, and manage your Email and other supported accounts. You can also use these settings to control how and whether all applications send, receive, and synchronise data on their own schedules, and whether all applications can synchronise user data automatically.

Use Date & Time settings to customise your preferences for how date and time are displayed.

#### Set date

Touch to open a dialogue where you can manually set the phone's date.

#### Set time

Touch to open a dialogue where you can manually set the phone's time.

#### Select time zone

Touch to open a dialogue where you can set the phone's time zone

#### Use 24-hour format

Mark the checkbox to display the time using 24-hour clock format

#### Choose date format

Touch to open a dialogue where you can select the format for displaying dates.

# 11.5.2 Schedule power on/off

Touch to preset the power on/off time and repeat mode.

# 11.5.3 Accessibility

You use the Accessibility settings to configure any accessibility plug-ins you have installed on your phone.

#### TalkBack

Touch to turn on/off TalkBack.

#### Captions

Touch to turn on/off Captions.

# Magnification gestures

Touch to turn on/off to activate/deactivate zoom in/out function by triple-tapping the screen.

# Large text

Mark the checkbox to enlarge the screen text.

#### Power button ends call

Mark the checkbox to end a call by pressing **Power** key during the call.

#### Auto rotate screen

Mark the checkbox to rotate screen automatically.

#### Speak passwords

Mark the checkbox to speak passwords while typing.

# Accessibility shortcut

Touch to turn on/off to enable/disable accessibility features.

# Text-to-speech output

Touch to open Text-to speech output options.

# Touch & hold delay

Touch to adjust the duration of touch and hold delay. This function enables your phone to differ touch and touch & hold, which may avoid incorrect operations.

# Quick boot

Mark the checkbox to enable quick boot.

# 11.5.4 Developer options

To access this function, touch **Settings > About phone**, then touch **Build number** 7 times. Now **Developer options** is available

The Development screen contains settings that are useful for developing Android applications. For full information, including documentation of the Android applications and development tools, see the Android developer web site (http://developer.android.com).

#### Take bug report

Touch to select to collect information about your current device state and send as an email message.

# Desktop backup password

Touch to set/change/remove desktop full backup password.

### Stay awake

Mark the checkbox to prevent the screen from dimming and locking when the phone is connected to a charger or to a USB device that provides power. Don't use this setting with a static image on the phone for long periods of time, or the screen may be marked with that image.

### Select runtime

Touch to choose Use Dalvik or Use ART.

Mark the checkbox to show GPU overdraw.

# Debug non-rectangular clip operations

Mark the checkbox to show non-rectangular clip operations.

Mark the checkbox to enable 4x MSAA.

Mark the checkbox to select to always use GPU for screen compositing.

#### Strict mode enabled

Mark the checkbox to enable strict mode. After enabled, the screen will flash when applications do long operations on the main thread.

Touch to view Regulatory & Safety information, including Product model, Manufacturer name, etc.

# 11.5.6 About phone

This contains information about things ranging from Legal information, Model number, Android version, Baseband version, Kernel version, Build number, Custom build version to those listed below:

### System updates

Touch to check for system updates.

# System updates (storage)

Touch to check for system updates (storage).

#### Status

This contains the status of the Battery status, Battery level, My phone number, Network, Signal strength, etc.

# Legal information

Touch to view legal information.

# 12 Update your phone's software

Using the FOTA (Firmware Over The Air) Upgrade tool you can update your phone's software.

To access System updates, open the Notification panel and touch and the phone will search for the latest software. If you want to update the system, please touch Download, and when that's finished, touch Install to complete the upgrade. Now your phone will have the latest version of the software.

You should turn on data connection before searching for updates. Settings for auto-check intervals and reminders about upgrades are also available once you restart the phone.

If you have chosen auto-check, when the system discovers the new version, the icon will appear in the status bar. Touch the notification to access the **System updates** directly.



During FOTA downloading or updating, to avoid errors in locating the correct update packages, do not change your default storage location.

# Product safety information RF exposure

# General statement on RF energy

Your phone contains a transmitter and a receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your phone transmits.

# Specific Absorption Rate (SAR)

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organisation ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to ensure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg and the highest SAR value for this device when tested at the ear was 0.932 W/kg <sup>(1)</sup>. As mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in other positions, such as on the body as described in this user quide.

As SAR is measured utilising the device's highest transmitting power, the actual SAR of this device while operating is typically below that indicated above. This is due to automatic changes to the power level of the device to ensure it only uses the minimum power required to communicate with the network.

# Body worn operation

Important safety information regarding radiofrequency radiation (RF) exposure.

To ensure compliance with RF exposure guidelines the phone must be used with a minimum of 10 mm separation from the body.

"The highest SAR value for this mobile phone when tested for use at the body and compliance against the standard is 1.01 W/kg. #### Limiting exposure to radio frequency (RF) fields

#### Distraction

# Driving

Full attention must be given to driving at all times in order to reduce the risk of an accident.
