

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

# Your Vodafone TV PLAY explained



- 1 Bluetooth pairing LED indicator
- 2 Microphone on/off button
- 3 Microphone
- 4 Antenna Connector
- 5 Ethernet input port

- 6 HDMI® input port
- 7 USB input port
- 8 Power adapter port
- 9 Reset button

#### Top panel (1-3)

Bluetooth pairing LED indicator (1) This light indicates the status of Bluetooth pairing with other devices.

Microphone on/off button (2)
Press this button to toggle the microphone on or off.

Microphone (3)
This built-in microphone allows you to interact with your Vodafone TV Box using voice commands.

#### Back panel connections (4-9)

Antenna Connector (4)

Connect your antenna cable to this connector to receive terrestrial television signals on your Vodafone TV Box.

Ethernet port (5)

Connect an Ethernet cable to this port for a wired network connection to your router.

HDMI® input port (6) onnect an HDMI cable to this port for high-definition video and audio output to your TV.

USB input port (7)

This port can be used to connect compatible USB devices, such as storage drives, to the Vodafone TV Box.

Power adaptor port (8)


Connect the supplied power adapter to this port to provide power to the Vodafone TV Box.

Reset Button (9)

Press this button to reset the Vodafone TV Box to its factory settings. You usually need to press and hold it for a few seconds.

# How to connect your Vodafone TV PLAY

This page describes how to connect your Vodafone TV Play to your router and TV using the provided cables.




**Note:** For a better audio experience, the Vodafone TV PLAY must not be hidden or placed in a closed space, it must have a wall or the TV screen behind.

1 Step 1: Connecting the ethernet cable (connecting to the router)
Plug the supplied Ethernet cable into the connector marked
"Ethernet" (5) on the rear panel of the Vodafone TV PLAYand the
other end into a free Ethernet connector on your router.
The Ethernet port is rectangular. Ensure the cable's bendy clip is
oriented correctly.

**Wi-Fi Note:** In case you would like to set up the Vodafone TV PLAY via Wi-Fi, you will need to do that within the initial installation following instructions on screen on your TV (see step 7).


- 2 Step 2: Connecting the HDMI cable (connecting to the TV)
  Plug the supplied HDMI cable into the connector marked "HDMI" on
  the rear panel of the Vodafone TV PLAY, and the other end into an
  available HDMI connector on your television. The HDMI port is flat
  and rectangular.
- To disable Wi-Fi, simply turn off the Wi-Fi switch in the product settings menu.

Plug the supplied power adapter into the connector marked "POWER" on the rear panel of your Vodafone TV PLAY and then plug into an electrical socket.



Step 4: Opening the battery compartment


Please open the battery compartment at the back of your remote by pressing the cover downwards and place the batteries inside in order to use the remote control.

5 Step 5: Inserting the batteries

Place the supplied 2xAAA batteries in the remote control. The ring around the power button of the remote will blink and let you know it is ready to use. 6 Step 6: Using the power button

Use the Power button on the remote control to switch on the Vodafone TV or set it back into standby mode.

### LED states and behaviours




Step 7: Selecting the correct HDMI source on your TV

Ensure your TV is displaying the output of the HDMI source equivalent to the number of the HDMI connector into which you plugged the HDMI cable in step 2. For example if you plugged into the HDMI 1, you should have the output HDMI 1 displayed.

#### Step 8: Completing the firsttime installation

Now complete the first installation process by following the steps shown on your TV screen.



#### **BOX STATES**

- One white light constant
  Device is on
- One red light constant
   Device is in low power mode
- Red LED light pulsing slowly
  Maintenance, factory reset or firmware
  update
- Red LED light blinking fast (flashing)
  Error occuring

#### MICROPHONE MUTE BUTTON STATES


- One orange light constant Microphone muted
- No light Microphone unmuted
