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
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1 Your phone

1.1 Keys and connectors





Recents button

 Touch: this shows your recently-used apps. Touch an image to open it, or swipe it up to remove it from the list

Home button

- While on any app or screen, touch the Home button to return to the main Home screen.
- Touch & hold this button to access Google Assistant.

✓ Back button

 Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialogue box, options menu, the Notification panel, etc.

These buttons are always visible when you use the screen.

Power key

- Press: activate the lock screen/wake up the screen.
- Press and hold: show the pop-up menu to select from Power off, Restart, Screenshot, Flight mode.
 Press and hold: power on.
- Press and hold the Power key and the Volume down key to capture a screenshot.

Volume keys

- During a call, these keys serve to adjust the volume of the earpiece or headset.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, these keys serve to adjust the media volume.
- In general mode, these keys also serve to adjust the ringtone volume.
- Mute the ringtone of an incoming call.

1.2 Getting started

1.2.1 Set-up

Inserting or removing the SIM card or microSD card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls.



Insert the pin into the hole and pull out the tray. Place the SIM card or microSD card with the chip facing downwards on the tray, and put the tray into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the SIM card or microSD card, pull out the tray.



Your phone only supports nano-SIM card. Do not attempt to insert other SIM types like mini and micro cards; otherwise you may damage your phone. Only FAT32 file system is supported on the microSD card.

Charging the battery



To charge the battery, connect the charger to your phone and mains socket. You can also charge your phone via a USB cable.



Your phone is battery embedded design with nonremovable battery or back cover. Unauthorised personnel are strictly prohibited from disassembling the phone. To reduce energy wastage, disconnect your charger from the plug when the battery is fully charged.

To reduce your phone's power consumption, switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or apps running in the background when not needed. In Settings you can also lower the brightness of the screen, and shorten the length of time before the screen goes to sleep.

1.2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on. It will take a few seconds before the screen lights up. Swipe to unlock your phone, or use the PIN, Password, Pattern if you have set this up already.

If you do not know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your phone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

Set up your phone for the first time

The first time you power on the phone you will be asked to set the following options: language, mobile data, Google account, date & time, etc.

- 1. Select the phone's language, and then touch **LET'S GO**.
- Insert a SIM card or touch SKIP.
- 3. Select a Wi-Fi network, or touch **SKIP** and then **CONTINUE**.
- 4. Adjust Date & time if needed, then touch NEXT.
- 5. Read Google Services and then ACCEPT.
- 6. Touch **SET UP** to set up Face Unlock, or touch **SKIP**.
- Protect your phone, set screen lock now or touch **Not now** and then touch **SKIP ANYWAY**.
- Touch the switch to disable/enable the improvement of your phone by sending anonymous diagnostics and usage data, learn privacy policy on data protection and software updates, and touch NEXT.
- 9. Set font size, and touch DONE.
- 10. View the display size, adjust if needed, and touch **DONE**.
- Read more warnings about this device before you using it, then touch Done.

If you power on your phone with no SIM card inserted, you will still be able to connect to a Wi-Fi network to sign into your Google account and to use some features.

1.2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the **Power** key from the Home screen until the Phone options appear, then select **Power off**.

1.3 Home screen

Touching the **Home** button always takes you to your main Home screen, and you can personalise all your Home screens by adding your favourite apps, shortcuts and widgets to them.



The Home screen extends on either side of the screen to allow more space for adding apps, shortcuts, etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view of the Home screen.

1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

Touch &

To access an app, touch it with your finger.

Touch and hold &

Touch and hold the Home screen to access the available options for setting the wallpaper.

Drag 4

Touch and hold an item to be able to drag it to another location.

Slide/Swipe

Slide the screen to scroll up and down lists, screens of apps, images, web pages, etc.



Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it moves quicker.

Pinch/Spread

Place your fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.



Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways.

1.3.2 Status bar

From status bar, you can view both phone status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side).



Notification panel


Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Quick settings panel and drag down again to open the Quick settings panel. Touch and drag up to close it. From the Notification panel, you can open items and other reminders indicated by notification icons or view wireless service information.



Touch a notification and slide it sideways to delete it.

Touch **CLEAR ALL** to clear all event–based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).

In Quick settings panel, touch the Settings to access **Settings**.



1.3.3 Search bar

The phone provides a Search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the phone or the web.



a Search by text

- Touch the Search bar from the Home screen.
- Enter the text/phrase you want to search for.
- Touch an on the keyboard if you want to search on the web.

b Search by voice

- Touch I from Search bar to display a dialog screen.
- Speak the word/phrase you want to search for. A list of search results will display for you to select from.

1.3.4 Lock/Unlock vour screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock your phone screen with a variety of patterns, PIN or password, etc. through Settings > Security & location > Screen lock.

To create a screen unlock pattern (Follow onscreen instructions)

- Touch Settings > Security & location > Screen lock > Pattern
- Draw your own pattern.



To create a screen unlock PIN/Password

- Touch Settings > Security & location > Screen lock > PIN or Password.
- Set your PIN or password.


To lock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to lock the screen.

To unlock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, draw the unlock pattern you have created or enter PIN or password to unlock the screen

If you have chosen Swipe as the screen lock, slide upward to unlock the screen



To unlock your phone using facial recognition

For ease of use, you can also unlock your phone by simply looking at it, through Settings > Security & location > Face unlock

• To set up facial recognition select Face unlock, and follow the on-screen instructions

 WARNING: Face-matching is less secure than a pattern, PIN or password. Someone who looks like you, or who has a photo or video of you may be able to unlock your phone.

1.3.5 Personalise your Home screen

Touch and hold an empty place on the Home screen, a popup options menu will display for your selection.



Add an app or widget

Touch the Application tab ..., then touch and hold the app to activate the Move mode, and drag the item to any Home screen.

Touch and hold the blank space on any Home screen, choose **WIDGETS** and drag widget to the Home screen.

Reposition an app or widget

Touch and hold the item to be repositioned to activate the Move mode, drag the item to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favourites tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

Remove

Touch and hold the item to be removed to activate the Move mode, drag the item up to the top of **Remove** icon, and release after the item turns grev.

Create folders

To make it easier to organise apps and shortcuts on the Home screen and the Favourite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

Wallpaper customisation

Touch and hold an empty area on the Home screen or go to **Settings > Display > Wallpaper** to customise your wallpaper.

1.3.6 Volume adjustment

Using volume key

Press **Volume** key to adjust the volume. To activate silence mode, press the **Volume down** key until the phone is silenced.

Using Settings menu

Drag down twice from the notification panel and touch the settings to enter **Settings**, then touch **Sound**, you can set the volume of calls, media, notification, system and etc. to your preference.

Text input

2.1 Using the onscreen keyboard


Onscreen keyboard settings

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, select **Settings > System > Language & input**.

Adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation

Turn the phone sideways or upright to adjust the Onscreen keyboard orientation. You can also adjust it by changing the settings (go to Settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen).

2.2 Text editing

You can edit the text you have entered.

- Touch and hold or double-tap on the text you would like to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the highlighted selection.
- The following options will show: Cut, Copy, Paste⁽¹⁾, Share, Select all and Translate.

You can also insert new text

- Touch where you want to type, or touch and hold a blank space, the cursor will blink and the tab will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have selected any text, touch the tab to show PASTE icon
 which allows you to paste any text you have previously copied.



⁽¹⁾ It won't appear until you copied some text.



3.1 Phone call

3.1.1 Placing a call

To make a call when the phone is active, go to the Home screen and touch \bigcirc in the Favourites tray.





Enter the number you want from the dial pad directly or touch a contact from **Contacts, Recent** or **Favourites** tab to place the call

The number you entered can be saved to Contacts by touching Create new contact or Add to a contact.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching ${\color{red} \,\boxtimes\,}$.

To hang up a call, touch 💿 .

International call

To dial an international call, touch and hold O to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and finally touch \bigcirc .

Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial emergency number and touch \(\mathbb{L} \) to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code \((1) \).

3.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call, a call window will be presented on top of the screen. Touch **DECLINE** to dismiss a call or **ANSWER** to answer a call.



Touch the call window to open the Phone call screen.

On the Phone call screen, touch

- Swipe the icon up to answer the call;
- Swipe the icon down to reject the call;
- Touch **Reply** to reject the call by sending a preset message.

To mute incoming calls, press the Volume up/down key.

3.1.3 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can access at any time.

To listen to your voicemail, touch and hold 1 on dial pad.

To set your voicemail number, touch \ddagger from the phone screen and touch **Settings > Voicemail**.

If you receive a voicemail, a voicemail icon \mathbf{QO} appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel, touch **New voicemail**.

3.1.4 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the **Volume up/down** key.



- Touch to hold the current call. Touch this icon again to retrieve the call.
- Touch to display the dial pad.
- Touch to end the current call.
- Touch to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.
- Touch to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.
- Touch to place a call to another contact.



3.1.5 Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

Conference calls (1)

You can set up a conference call.

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch 📞 .
- Enter the phone number of the person you want to add to conference and touch . You can also add participants from Contacts or Recents.
- Touch \uparrow to start a conference call.
- During a conference call, touch to drop a participant or to talk privately to one of the participants. Touch to drop the participant from the conference, touch to talk privately to the participant and put the other participants on hold.
- Touch to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

3.1.6 Call settings

From the phone screen, touch $\mbox{\fontfamily{0.5ex}\hspace}$ and touch $\mbox{\fontfamily{0.5ex}\hspace}$ settings, the following options are available:

Display options

Sort by

Touch to set the contacts display to First name or Surname.

Name format

Touch to set the name format to First name first or Surname first.

Sounds and vibration

Touch to set phone ringtone, keypad tones, etc.

Quick responses

Touch to edit quick responses which will be used when you reject a call with messages.

⁽¹⁾ Depending on your network operator.

Calling accounts

Touch to view your network operators of each SIM card⁽¹⁾.

Blocked numbers

Select **ADD A NUMBER** to block a specific number. You will not receive any calls or texts from that number.

Voicemail

Notifications

Touch to set notifications when a voicemail is received.

Advanced Settings

Service

Opens a dialogue box where you can select your carrier's voicemail service or another service.

Setup

If you are using your carrier's voicemail service, this opens a dialogue box where you can enter the phone number to use for listening to and managing your voicemail.

Accessibility

• TTY mode

TTY mode can be used by people who are deaf, have poor hearing or speech impairments. Touch to set TTY mode. Touch to select TTY mode.

· Hearing aids

Touch the switch to enable/disable hearing-aid compatibility.

Noise Reduction

Touch the switch to enable/disable your background noise reduction during calls.

Caller ID & spam

Touch the switch to enable/disable Caller ID & spam when you receive a call.

Nearby places

Touch the switch to enable/disable Nearby places, which will use your location to find nearby places that match your query.

· Personalised search results

Touch the switch to enable/disable function of Personalised search results, which improves your results from your search history.

Google Account

Touch to add your Google account in order to use the functionality of Nearby places.

Location settings

Touch to get more location settings information.

3.2 Recents

You can view your call history in $\ensuremath{\mathbf{Recents}}$ tab from the Phone screen.

Touch a contact's photo to open the Quick Contact panel.

In Quick Contact panel, you can view detailed information of a call, launch a new call or send messages to a contact or number, or add numbers to **Contacts** (only available for unsaved phone numbers), etc.

To clear the entire call memory, touch $\mathring{}_{\circ}$ from the Phone screen and touch **Clear frequents**.


3.3 Contacts



You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronise these with your Gmail contacts or other apps on the web or on your phone.

3.3.1 View your contacts

To access **Contacts** app, touch the Application tab on the Home screen, then select **Contacts**.



Touch to display contacts list option menu.

Following actions are available:

Create label

Touch to create label, which allows you to add contacts in the label.

Settings

Your info

Set up your profile.

Accounts

Manage the synchronisation settings for different accounts.

Sort by

Touch to set the contacts display to First name or Surname.

Name format

Touch to set the name format to First name first or Surname first.

Default account for new contacts

Manage the default account for new contacts.

Phonetic name

Touch to set phonetic name to show or hide.

• Import/Export

Import or export contacts between phone, SIM card, and microSD card, or share contacts.

· Blocked numbers

When defining specific numbers as blocked numbers, then you won't receive calls and texts from them any more.

3.3.2 Adding a contact

Touch the Application tab on the Home screen, select the **Contacts**, then touch (2) in the contact list to create a new contact.



If you want to add more information, scroll the screen down and touch **More fields** to add a new category.

When finished, touch

to save.

To exit without saving, you can touch $\,$ and then <code>Discard</code>.

Add to/remove from Favourites

To add a contact to favourites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch to add the contact to favourites.

To remove a contact from favourites, touch on contact details screen.



Only phone and account contacts can be added to favourites.

3.3.3 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch \nearrow in the contact details screen. When finished, touch \checkmark .

Change a contact's default phone number

The default phone number (the number which has priority when making a call or sending a message) will always be displayed under the contact name.

To change the default phone number, touch and hold the number you want to set as the default number from the contact's details screen, then select **Set default**. A **\mathbb{L}** appears before the number.

This choice is only available when the contact has more than one number.

Delete a contact

To delete a contact, touch from the Contacts detail screen and touch **Delete**.



The contact you have deleted will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronise your phone.

3.3.4 Communicating with your contacts

From contact details screen, you can communicate with your contacts by making a call or exchanging messages.



- Touch to make a call.
- Touch to send a text message.
- ☐ Touch to set up a video call.

3.3.5 Importing, exporting and sharing contacts

From the Contacts screen, touch it open the options menu, touch **Settings** then touch **Import** or **Export** to import/export contacts from/to your SIM card, Phone, microSD card, Phone storage, Accounts, etc.

You can share a single contact or multiple contacts with others via Bluetooth. Gmail. etc.

To do this, touch a contact you want to share, touch $\frac{1}{2}$ and **Share** from contact details screen, then select the app to perform this action.

3.3.6 Synchronising contacts in multiple accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronised from multiple accounts, depending on the apps installed on your phone.

To add an account, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, select **Settings > Accounts > Add account**.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Exchange, etc.

As with other account set-ups, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account and all associated information from the phone. On the **Accounts** screen, touch the account you want to delete, touch and select **Remove account**, and then confirm.

Sync

You can synchronise an account on **Accounts** screen, touch a next to Automatically sync data.

4 Message & Email




4.1 Messages

Your phone can create, edit and receive chat, SMS and MMS messages.

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and select **Messages**.

4.1.1 Create a new message

On the message list screen, touch to write new text/multimedia messages.



Sending a text message

Enter the mobile phone number of the recipient on the **To** bar or touch - to add recipients. Touch the **Text message** bar to enter the text of the message. When you've finished, touch to send the text message.



An SMS of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. Specific letters (like accents) will also increase the size of the SMS. This may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, and audio to other compatible phones and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, etc.) are attached or email addresses are added.

To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the To bar, touch Text message bar to enter the text of the message. touch to open attachment options, select a picture, the location, an audio file or contacts that you want to add as attachments.

When finished, touch to send the multimedia message. Attach options:



Touch to select an emoji as an attachment.



Touch to select a sticker.



View your Photos, Gallery, or File Manager to select a picture as an attachment.



Touch and share your location.



Touch and hold the voice message recorder to record a voice message.

4.1.2 Manage messages

When a new message comes, an icon will appear on status bar as notification. Drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, touch the new message to open it. You can also access Messages and touch the new message to open it.

Messages are displayed in conversational order.

To reply to a message, touch the current message to enter message-composing screen, enter the text, and then touch

Touch and hold a message in message details screen, the following options will be available:



Touch to archive the current message.



Touch to delete the current message.



Touch to block the selected number. You will not receive any calls or texts from this number.

4.1.3 Adjust message settings

In message list screen, touch $\mbox{\cite{line}}$ and select $\mbox{\bf Settings}.$

Default SMS app

Touch to change default SMS app.

Notifications

Touch the switch to turn on/off notifications for Messages.

Behaviour

Touch to choose the notification type for incoming messages.

Advanced

Touch to set additional settings for **Messages**.

Hear outgoing message sounds

Touch the switch to enable/disable to hear message sounds when you send a message.

Your current country

Touch to choose your current country.

Advanced

• Group messaging

Touch to select mass text or group MMS mode.

Auto-download MMS

Touch the switch to enable/disable the automatic download of MMS

Auto-download MMS when roaming

Touch the switch to enable/disable the automatic download of MMS when roaming.

Use simple characters

Touch the switch to enable/disable the use of simple characters in SMS.

Get SMS delivery reports

Touch the switch to enable/disable SMS delivery reports.

Wireless alerts

Touch to access wireless alerts settings.

· SIM card messages

Touch to view messages on SIM card.

Phone number

Show your phone number.

4.2 Gmail



The first time you set up your phone, you can select to use an existing Gmail account or to create a new Email account.

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. Gmail on your phone can be automatically synchronised with your Gmail account on the web. Unlike other email accounts, each message and its replies in Gmail are grouped in your inbox as a single conversation; all emails are organised by labels instead of folders.

To access Gmail

From the Home screen, touch the Application tab to enter the applications list, then touch **Gmail**.

Gmail displays messages and conversations from one single Gmail account at a time, if you own more than one account, you can add an account by touching and select **Settings** from Inbox screen, then touch **Add account**. Besides your Gmail account, you can also add or set up external email accounts by choosing Personal (IMAP/POP) or Exchange. When finished, you can switch to another by touching the account name from Inbox screen, then select the account you want to view.

To create and send emails

- 1 Touch from Inbox screen.
- 2 Enter recipient(s)'s email address in To field.
- 3 If necessary, touch the popup menu icon ~ Add Cc/Bcc to add a copy or a blind copy to the message.
- 4 Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- 5 Touch and select Attach file to add an attachment.
- 6 Finally, touch > to send.

7 If you do not want to send the mail out right away, you can touch and then Save draft or touch the Back button to save a copy. To view the draft, touch your account name to display all labels. then select **Drafts**.

If you do not want to send or save the mail, you can touch and then touch **Discard**.

To add a signature to emails, touch and then touch **Settings** from inbox screen, choose an account, then touch **Signature**.

To receive and read your emails

When a new email arrives, you will be notified by a ringtone or vibration, and an icon will appear on Status bar.

Drag down the Status bar to display the Notification panel, touch the new email to view it. You can also access the Gmail Inbox to view the new email.

You can search for an email by sender, recipient, subject, etc.

- Touch Q from Inbox screen.
- Enter the keyword you want to search for in the searching box and touch a on the software keyboard.

When viewing an email, touch to reply

5 Calendar, Alarm clock & Calculator

5.1 Calendar


Use Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Calendar**.

5.1.1 Multimode view

You can display the Calendar in daily, weekly, monthly, or agenda view.

To change your Calendar view, touch to open list menu for your options. Touch to return to Today's view.



5.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch 🕕
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a wholeday event, you can enable All-day option.

When finished, touch SAVE from the top of the screen.

To delete or edit an event

To edit an event, touch the event to enter details screen, touch

To delete an event, touch the event to enter details screen,
touch

and Delete to delete it.

5.1.3 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event 31 will appear on Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, and touch the event name to view Calendar notification.

Touch **Snooze** to turn off all event reminders for 5 minutes.

Touch **Back** button to keep the reminders pending in the status bar and the Notification panel.

Touch from Calendar main screen to refresh the calendar:

Touch to enter Calendar **Settings** to set a series of Calendar settings.

5.2 Clock

Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Clock**.

Touch to add or set an alarm.

5.2.1 To set an alarm

From the **Clock** screen, touch to enter the **Alarms** screen, and touch to add a new alarm. Following options will show:

Time

Set the time for your alarm.

Touch the switch next to the time you have set to turn the alarm on/off.

• Repeat

Mark the checkbox to activate Repeat. Select the days you want the alarm to be repeated.

Alarm sound

Touch to select an alarm sound.

Vibrate

Mark the checkbox to activate/deactivate vibration.

Label

Touch to set a name for the alarm.

Delete

Touch to delete the alarm.

5.2.2 To adjust alarm settings

Touch from **Alarms** screen. The following options will be available under **Settings**:

Clock

Style

Touch to set Analogue or Digital style.

. Display time with seconds

Touch the switch to enable the display time with seconds function.

Automatic home clock

Touch the switch to set home clock while travelling in a different time zone

Home time zone

Touch to set home time zone.

Change date & time

Touch to set date and time.

Night clock

Touch to enable night clock.

Alarms

Silence after

Touch to set the time limit for the alarm tone duration.

Snooze length

Touch to choose length of snooze.

Alarm volume

Touch to set the alarm tone volume.

• Gradually increase volume

Touch to set gradually increase volume.

Volume buttons

Touch to choose ${\bf Snooze}, {\bf Dismiss}$ or ${\bf Control\ volume}$ as volume buttons.

· Start week on

Touch to select the first day of a week as per your preference from **Monday**. **Friday**. **Saturday**. or **Sunday**.

Timers

Timer sound

Touch to select timer sound.

· Gradually increase volume

Touch to set gradually increase volume.

Touch the switch to enable vibration for timer.

5.3 Calculator




With Calculator, you can solve many mathematical problems.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch ${\bf Calculator}.$

There are two panels available: Basic panel and Advanced panel.

To switch between panels, select one of the following two ways:

- Drag to the left to open the Advanced panel.
- Turn the device to the landscape mode from the basic panel to open the Advanced panel⁽¹⁾.



⁽¹⁾ If "Settings\Display\Auto-rotate screen" is off, this way will not work.

6 Getting connected

Your phone can connect to the Internet using either GPRS/EDGE/3G/4G or Wi-Fi.

6.1 Connecting to the Internet

6.1.1 GPRS/EDGE/3G/4G

The first time you turn on your phone with the SIM card inserted, it will automatically configure a mobile network service: GPRS, EDGE, 3G, 4G. If the network is not connected, you can turn on Mobile data by touching the Application tab from the Home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Mobile network.

To check the network connection you are using, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings** > **Network & Internet** > **Mobile networks** > **Access point names**.

To create a new access point

A new mobile network connection can be added to your phone with the following steps:

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Mobile networks > Access point names.
- 3 Then touch (+) to add new APN.
- 4 Enter the required APN information.
- 5 When finished, touch and Save.

To activate/deactivate Data roaming

When roaming, you can decide to connect/disconnect to a data service.

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Mobile networks.

- 3 Touch to activate or deactivate data roaming.
- 4 When Data roaming is deactivated, you can still perform data exchange with a Wi-Fi connection (refer to "6.1.2 Wi-Fi").

6.1.2 Wi-Fi

You can connect to the Internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your phone even without a SIM card inserted.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Wi-Fi.
- 3 Touch to turn on/off Wi-Fi.
- 4 Touch **Wi-Fi**, detailed information of all detected Wi-Fi networks is displayed.
- 5 Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (contact network operator for details). When you're finished, touch CONNECT.

To activate notification when a new network is detected

When Wi-Fi is on and the network notification is activated, the Wi-Fi icon will appear on the status bar whenever the phone detects an available wireless network within range. The following steps activate the notification function when Wi-Fi is on:

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Wi-Fi.
- 3 Touch **Wi-Fi preference** from the bottom of the Wi-Fi screen.
- 4 Touch next to **Open network notification** to activate/ deactivate this function.

To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Wi-Fi.
- 3 Touch **Add network** from the bottom of the Wi-Fi screen.
- 4 Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- 5 Touch CONNECT.

When successfully connected, your phone will be connected automatically the next time you are within range of this network.

To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- 1 Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- 2 In the Wi-Fi screen, touch the name of the saved network.
- 3 Touch **FORGET** in the dialogue that opens.

6.2 Chrome




Using the Chrome browser you can enjoy surfing the Web.

To get onto the Web, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Chrome**.

To go to a web page

On Chrome browser screen, touch the URL box at the top, enter the address of the web page, and touch to confirm.



6.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings > Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth**.

To turn on Bluetooth

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth.
- 3 Touch to activate/deactivate this function.

To make your phone more recognizable, you can change your phone name which is visible to others.

1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch ${\bf Settings.}$

2 Touch Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth.

- 3 Touch Device name.
- 4 Enter a name, and touch RENAME to confirm.

To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth.
- 3 Touch Pair new device.
- 4 Touch a Bluetooth device you want to be paired with in the list.
- 5 A dialog will popup, touch **PAIR** to confirm.
- 6 If the pairing is successful, your phone connects to the device.

To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- 1 Touch after the device name you want to unpair.
- 2 Touch FORGET.

6.4 Connecting to a computer via USB

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your phone and computer.

To connect:

- Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- Open the Notification panel and touch USB for file transfer, then, in the next dialog, choose the way in which you want to transfer files.

To locate data you have transferred or downloaded in the internal storage:

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen to open the apps list.
- 2 Touch Files.

All data you have downloaded is stored in **Files**, where you can view media files (videos, photos, music and others), rename files, install apps onto your phone, etc.

6.5 To safely remove the microSD card from your phone

The microSD card can be removed from your phone any time the phone is powered off. To remove the microSD card while the phone is on, you must unmount the storage card from the phone first, to prevent corrupting or damaging the storage card.

To unmount the microSD card

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Storage > SD card.
- 3 Touch and select Storage settings.
- 4 Touch the **EJECT** button to confirm.

Additionally, you can simply touch riangle next to the SD card to eject it. Both options serve to safely remove the microSD card from the phone.

To format a microSD card

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Storage > SD card.
- 3 Touch and select Storage settings.
- 4 Touch FORMAT SD CARD to confirm.

6.6 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer via a USB cable (USB tethering) or with up to five devices at once by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot or via Bluetooth.



Sharing data may incur additional charges from your network operator. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas.

To share your phone's data connection via USB

Use the USB cable that **came** along with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer.

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Hotspot & tethering..
- 3 Touch next to USB tethering to activate/deactivate this function.

To share your phone's data connection as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Hotspot & tethering > Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 3 Touch to activate/deactivate this function.

To share your phone's data connection via Bluetooth

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Hotspot & tethering.
- 3 Touch next to **Bluetooth tethering** to activate/deactivate this function.

To rename or secure your portable hotspot

When Portable Wi-Fi hotspot is activated, you could change the name of your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Hotspot & tethering > Set up Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 3 Touch Set up Wi-Fi hotspot to change the network SSID or set your network security.
- 4 Touch SAVE.

6.7 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

To add a VPN

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch ${\bf Settings.}$
- 2 Touch **Network & Internet** > **VPN** and then touch +.
- 3 In the screen that opens, follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- 4 Touch SAVE.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a lock screen pattern, PIN code or password for your phone.

To connect/disconnect to a VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > VPN.
- 3 VPNs you have added are listed; touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- 4 In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch **CONNECT**.

To disconnect:

 Open the Notification panel and touch the resulting notification for VPN disconnection.

To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings.**
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > VPN.
- 3 VPNs you have added are listed, touch per next to the VPN you want to edit.
- 4 After finished, touch SAVE.

To delete:

Touch next to the VPN you want to delete, and touch
 FORGET to delete it

7 Google Play Store (1)



Google Play Store is an online software store, where you can download and install applications and games to your Android powered phone.

To open Google Play Store:

- \bullet Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch ${\bf Play\,Store}.$
- For the first time you access Google Play Store, a screen with terms of service pops up for your attention, touch Accept to continue.


8.1 Camera

Your mobile phone is fitted with a Camera for taking photos and recording videos.

Before using the Camera, make sure you have removed the protective lens foil from the camera.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen and then touch **Camera**.



To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch to take the picture which will be automatically saved.

To record a video

Slide to switch camera mode to Video and touch on the bottom centre of the screen to start recording a video.

Touch to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

Further operations when viewing a picture/video you have taken

- Touch Let to quick view the picture you have taken.
- Touch then Gmail, Bluetooth, MMS, etc. to share the photo or video you have taken.
- Touch the Back button to return to the Camera or Camcorder.

8.1.1 Camera settings

Before taking a photo/shooting a video, touch to adjust a number of settings in framing mode.

Modes

Manual Allows you to take full control of the

camera settings, letting you adjust aperture, shutter, ISO and more.

Night Touch to access night mode.

Time Lapse Allows you to create time lapse videos by

capturing a series of photos over a period of time and replay them at a faster speed.

Settings

• Video quality Touch to set video quality.

• **Shutter sound** Touch to turn on/off shutter sound.

• **Timer** Touch to select Self Timer mode.



8.2 Photos

Gallery acts as a media player for you to view photos and playback videos. In addition, a set of further operations to pictures and videos are available for your choice.

To access your photos, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Photos**.



To view a picture/play a video


Pictures and videos are displayed by albums in **Photos**.

- Touch an album and all pictures or videos will spread the screen.
- Touch the picture/video directly to view or play it.
- Slide up/down to view previous or next pictures/videos.

Working with pictures

You can edit pictures, add effects, crop, share, and set them as contact photo or wallpaper.

Select the picture you want to work on and touch the options available such as edit, share, crop or delete. Touch for more options.



Touch from full-screen picture view to edit a picture.



Touch to add effects such as Original, Auto, West etc.

Touch to adjust picture settings such as Exposure, vignette, etc.

Touch to Crop, Straighten, Rotate, Mirror or Draw the picture.

After activating the crop mode, the cropping square appears in the middle of the picture. Select the portion to crop, touch to confirm and SAVE, touch to exit without saving.

8.3 Play music



Using this menu, you can play music files stored on the microSD card in your phone. Music files can be downloaded from computer to microSD card using a USB cable.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Play Music**.

Touch and choose Music Library, you will find five categories in which all songs are classified: PLAYLISTS, ARTISTS, ALBUMS, SONGS, and GENRES. Slide left and right to view all. Touch SHUFFLE ALL to shuffle all songs in SONGS category.

9.1 Get My Location

9 1 1 Turn on GPS

To turn on your phone's global positioning system (GPS) satellite receiver:

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Security & location > Location.
- 3 Slide on to enable location and choose location mode you preferred.

9.1.2 Open Google Maps and view My Location

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch ${f Maps}.$

Touch on the map to view My Location.

The map will then center on a blue dot. Your actual position will be at the blue dot.



To move the map, drag the map with your finger.

To zoom in and out of a map, pinch or spread your fingers, or you can also zoom in by double-tapping a location on screen.

9.2 Search for a location

In the search box, enter an address, a city or a local business.

Touch the search icon to search, and in a while your search results will appear on the map as red dots. You can touch one to show a label.



9.3 Save a location

Just like bookmarking a web address on the Internet, you can star any position on the map for later use.

9.4 Open Street View for a location

- 1 Touch and hold a location to display its address at the bottom of the maps screen.
- 2 Drag up the details screen to sign in to save offline.
- 3 Touch & to display a Street View thumbnail.

9.5 Get driving, public transportation or walking directions

9.5.1 Get suggested routes for your trip



- 1 Touch enter bar to edit your start point by entering an address or selecting a saved item.
- 2 Do likewise for your end point.
- 3 To reverse directions, touch 1.
- 4 Then select a transport mode: driving by car, using public transportation, or walking directions.
- 5 Touch Route options to select Avoid motorways, Avoid tolls or Avoid ferries.
- 6 A couple of suggested routes will appear in a list. Touch any route to view its respective detailed direction.

10 Others



10.1 Files

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Files**.

Files works with both microSD card and phone storage.

File Manager displays all data stored on both microSD card and phone storage, including applications, media files; videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

When you download an application from PC to microSD card, you can locate the application on Files, then touch it to install it in your phone.

Files allows you to perform and be really efficient with the following common operations: create (sub) folder, open folder/file, view, rename, move, copy, delete, play, share, etc.


10.2 FM Radio



Your phone is equipped with a radio ⁽¹⁾. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you turn to stations that offer Visual Radio service.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **FM Radio**.

Please insert a headset to listen to the radio. The headset is used as an antenna for the radio.



Available options:

• Search Touch to scan channels.

• Channel list Touch to view channel list.

• Sleep timer Move slider to select when to automatically stop playback.

• Exit Turn off the radio.

The quality of the radio depends on the coverage of the radio station in that particular area.

To access settings menu, you can choose either of the following two wavs:

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, and touch **Settings**.
- 2 Drag down twice from the Notification panel and touch the Settings to access **Settings**.

11.1 Network & Internet

11.1.1 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can now surf the Internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your phone to the wireless network.

11.1.2 Mobile networks

You can select your preferred network with this menu.

11.1.3 Data usage

Data usage allows you to view the data you've used.

Data saver

Data saver helps to reduce data usage by preventing some apps from sending or receiving data in the background. Touch the switch to turn on/off data saver function

Mobile data

To enable/disable mobile data, touch the switch next to Mobile data.

App data usage

Touch to view mobile data used by each app.

• Data warning & limit

Touch the switch next to **Set data limit** to turn on data limit function. Touch **Data limit** to set the maximum amount of mobile data that you want to use. Your mobile data connection will be disabled when the specified limit is reached. You can also choose **App data usage cycle** to set reset date of each month.

Touch the switch next to **Set data warning** to turn on data warning function. Touch **Data warning** to set specific data volume. When reached, a warning message will be received.

Wi-Fi data usage

Touch to view Wi-Fi data usage of each applications.



Data usage is measured by your phone, and your carrier may count differently.

11.1.4 Hotspot & tethering

This function allows you to share your phone's mobile data connection via USB or as a portable Wi-Fi access point (Please refer to "6.6 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection".

11.1.5 SIM cards

To manage your SIM cards, go to **Settings > Network & Internet** > **SIM cards**.

Touch the switch to activate the use of your SIM card.

Touch the SIM card name to edit SIM card information like SIM name, Color, etc.

11.1.6 Flight mode

Use the **Flight mode** to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

You can also access Flight mode from Quick settings bar by dragging down the notification bar or from phone options menu when long pressing **Power** key.

11.1.7 VPN

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides mobile devices with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks. Mobile VPNs are used in environments where workers need to keep application sessions open at all times, throughout the working day, as the user connects via various wireless networks, encounters gaps in coverage, or suspend-and-resumes their devices to preserve battery life. A conventional VPN cannot survive such events because the network tunnel is disrupted, causing applications to disconnect, time out, fail, or even the computing device itself to crash.

For more information on VPN, please refer to "6.7 Connecting to virtual private networks"

11.1.8 Private DNS mode

Touch to select private DNS mode.

You need to enter hostname when Private DNS provider hostname is selected.

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your phone and computer. For more information on USB, please refer to "6.4 Connecting to a computer via USB".

11.3 Apps & notifications

You use the Apps settings to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their data and force them to stop, and to set whether you want to permit installation of applications that you obtain from web sites and emails. And you can also get further app or system notification settings.

11.4 Battery

In the Battery screen you can view the battery usage data since you last connected the phone to a power source. The screen also shows your battery status and how long it has been used since last charging. Touch a category to find out its specific power consumption.

You can adjust power use via the screen brightness or screen timeout in the Display screen.

11.5 Display

• Brightness level Touch to adjust the brightness of the screen.

• Screen Color Touch to adjust your screen color.

This menu displays the total amount of internal phone storage used. Touch Internal shared storage to view the amount of internal phone storage used by the operating system, its components, applications (including those you downloaded), permanent and temporary data.

Touch **FREE UP SPACE** button to free some space by removing older files.

Portable storage

Lists the amount of space on any microSD card installed in your phone and the amount you can use to store photos, videos, music, and other files. You can touch **SD card** to access the function and learn more details.
