

IBF Call-2

Track 1 – Kickstart 🎻



- Aim to kickstart international relationships.
- Standalone deliverables + possibly scoping/de-risking longer term projects.
 - Normally TRL 1-4.

Grant Values: £50k-£150k

Track 2 – Build and Sustain 🗱



- Projects with a level of maturity
- Building on established partnerships.
 - Require further investment in the international partnership.
 - Normally TRL 5-9

Grant Values: £150k - £500k



Assessment Criteria

Strategic goals	25%
 build stronger relationships with international partnerships, cementing our place as a trusted space partner of choice; leverage international partnerships to develop priority UK capabilities. 	
Value for Money	10%
Economic growth	20%
Benefits	15%
Technical feasibility	20%
Project Management	10%



International Engagement

Strong proposals will outline how their work responds to UK and international shared interests.

We particularly encourage applications to support partnerships with entities in Australia, Canada, France, Germany, Japan and the USA but also welcome applications for partnerships with other countries, including emerging space nations, where there are good opportunities to support IBF objectives.

Anonymised proposals may be **shared with international space agencies** for comment.

- Project start: By 1 September 2025
- Project end: By 31 March 2026



Application Checklist

- Max 2 applications per lead organisation (applies to all org types)
- Ensure all required
 boxes/forms are signed –
 missing fields = voided
 application
- Review the Grant Funding Agreement carefully (terms cannot be changed)
- Subsidy control compliance



Funding Summary

- Up to £5.5 million available in total
- 15–30 projects expected to be funded
- Two tracks:
 - Track 1: £50k–£150k
 - Track 2: £150k–£500k

Final decisions communicated Aug 25+
