Arnott's ANZ is proudly committed to sustainable practices for palm cultivation and in conjunction with our palm oil supplier, uses 100% traceable and certified sustainable supply, with no deforestation.

This has been achieved through:

1. Member of the RSPO

Arnott's ANZ and our supplier are active members of the Roundtable on Sustainable Palm Oil (RSPO).

2. Beyond RSPO – 100 % traceable and segregated supply

Further, our supplier has gone above and beyond RSPO requirements and works with a thirdparty NGO to trace our supply back to the mill.

While we demand all our suppliers adhere to the applicable environmental laws of the countries and regions in which they operate, Arnott's encourage our suppliers to surpass baseline requirements where possible to reduce the environmental impact of their operations.

3. Sourced from Peninsular Malaysia. Committed to no deforestation, no peat and no exploitation

All palm oil used by Arnott's in its Australian-made products is sourced from the Malaysian peninsular only, from land which has been used to produce palm oil or other agriculture crops. This is not an area experiencing deforestation issues and orang-utans are not found in the wild on the peninsula.

Arnott's ANZ is committed to no deforestation, no peat destruction and no exploitation of local communities and workers in the communities in which our palm oil supply originates.

As one of the major food companies in Australia, Arnott's aims for industry-leading policies that reflect our commitment to conduct business in a manner that respects and protects the environment.

Arnott's has been proudly baking biscuits in Australia for 150 years. 99% of Arnott's ANZ products are made in Australia at our three bakeries in Marleston, SA; Huntingwood, NSW; and Virginia, QLD. The statements above pertain to all Arnott's biscuits made at these sites.
