

# UNC Brain Development Study of Infants with Angelman Syndrome

*Do you (or someone you know) have a baby with Angelman syndrome (AS)?*

You can help us identify the earliest brain and behavioral features of AS by participating in the first MRI research study of its kind.

## Who is eligible?

Babies with AS, who are currently under 24 months of age.



## What Does Participation Involve?

- Traveling to UNC for two in-person visits: (1) the first visit between 6-12 months, if possible; (2) a second visit at 24 months of age.
- Behavioral and cognitive assessments at each visit (at no cost to the family) – with a summary of results for the family.
- A safe, non-invasive MRI brain scan during natural sleep (no anesthesia or sedation involved) – with a copy of the MRI for the family.
