## ACCESSIBLE DESIGN & CONTENT CHECKLIST

**DOES THE DESIGN...** 



Organise the page logically?	Have a text equivalent for everything?
Give each page a descriptive and unique title	All icons must have a written label (unless very commonly known)
Use structured H1, H2 etc headings	If a colour gives meaning, it must have a written label (E.g. green means selected)
Make sure headings are clear and helpful	All images must have a short description in an alt tag
Display content in logical order (even when styles are switched off)	If an alt tag isn't enough, provide a short written description (E.g. for charts)
Have a responsive and consistent layout?	Avoid images of text, except logos
Layouts, components and labelling should all be consistent	Provide a transcript for video and audio content
throughout	Provide subtitles and closed captions for video and audio content
All functionality should be available on all devices	
Everything should work even when text is resized	Allow keyboard navigation?
Use ems rather than pixels when defining text sizes for dev	All functionality should be available to keyboard users
Make sure links and buttons are obvious?	Swipe/pinch/drag etc functions have a keyboard option (E.g. carousels)
All links and buttons should be clearly identifiable - even without colour (E.g. underline or button design)	Make sure the keyboard never gets trapped (E.g. in menus and pop-ups)
All states of links and buttons should be visibly different - even	Design clear keyboard 'focus' states for all interactive elements
Without colour (E.g Default, hover, keyboard focus, clicked, selected, disabled)	Logical keyboard navigation tabbing order - sense check responsive layout order
The purpose of a link or button should be clear through its label or position	Provide a 'Skip to main content' link as the first item in the main navigation
Make it touch-friendly?	
Ensure all interactive elements have large clickable areas	Give options for main navigation?
	Offer at least 2 of these: Search, related pages, table of contents or site map
Ensure good colour contrast of at least:	
3:1 (A/AA) or 4:5:1 (AAA) for graphics and interactive elements (in all states)	Make forms easy to complete?
3:1 (A/AA) or 4:5:1 (AAA) for text that is bold and 19px or above	Provide text instructions at the start of a form
3:1 (A/AA) or 4:5:1 (AAA) for text that is normal and 24px or above	Clear labels for all form fields (not just in the placeholder text)
4:5:1 (A/AA) or 7:1 (AAA) for all smaller text	Layout that makes it easy to tell which label is for which field
	Have a written instruction for which fields are required (not just colour)
Not distract or pressure people unnecessarily?	Make errors easy to find and give instruction for how to correct them
Items should avoid automatically moving, blinking or scrolling (E.g. carousels)	Give easy ways to confirm and undo actions if a mistake could have consequences (E.g. making a payment or submitting sensitive information)
Provide pause, stop or hide functionality if content does	
Avoid putting time limits on tasks (E.g. countdown to purchase)	Avoid flashing images?
	Don't have content that flashes more than three times in one second
