





Ever since the 22nd Amendment was ratified in 1951, a president can serve a maximum of **TWO** 4-year terms.






The executive branch also includes the vice president as well as the president's **CABINET**, which is a group of trusted senior advisors who oversee different government departments.

FRANKLIN DELANO ROOSEVELT

is the only president to have served more than two terms, which he did before the 22nd Amendment was ratified in 1951.
