- 8. **Making Connections:** Thomas Edison explains to Leo and Layla how he realized that something he needed didn't exist, so he set his sights on being the person who created what was missing in people's lives.
 - a. How did Thomas Edison improve society with his ideas? Give an example. Sample answer: Thomas Edison improved society with his ideas by identifying a problem or need and then working to invent something to solve this problem or need. For example, his invention of the incandescent lightbulb helped replace electric lights in homes rather than gaslights, which scientists had been looking to replace for about 50 years.
 - b. Think of a problem or need in the world and devise a solution/invention to solve this problem or need. Remember, an invention must be something that does not already exist.

Sample answer:

Problem or Need: It is a problem when people don't pick up after their dogs when they don't have a bag.

Solution/Invention: A solution would be a small vacuum that is attached to the leash to suck up and easily dispose of waste.
