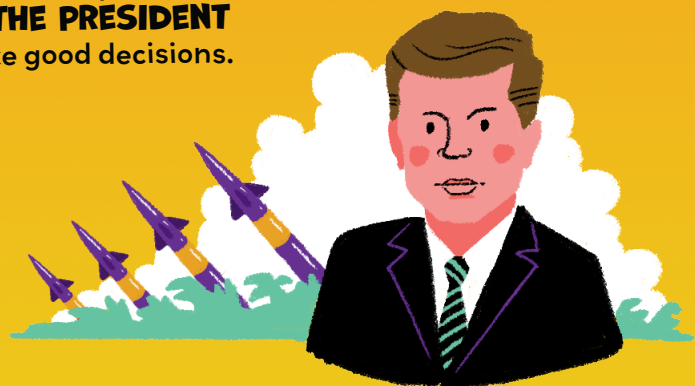
The main purpose of the Cabinet of the United States is to provide **ADVICE TO THE PRESIDENT** so he can make good decisions.
