- In your own words, explain how God was loving and patient with Gideon.
 Sample answer: God was loving and patient with Gideon because he understood that Gideon was not confident in himself. God knew Gideon better than Gideon knew himself. God gave Gideon three different signs so he knew that God was with him. This proof allowed Gideon to trust God fully.
- 2. Describe how God used trumpets, torches, and clay pots to defeat the Midianites. Sample answer: Gideon gave each soldier a horn, a torch, and a clay pot. God, through Gideon, instructed the soldiers on the signal to blow their horns all at once. The sound was deafening to the Midianites. The Israelites then all smashed their pots, revealing the torches. The Midianites felt surrounded and overwhelmed by the noise and sight of the torches. The Midianites were confused and began killing each other and running away. Even though they were greatly outnumbered, the Israelites defeated the Midianites because they followed God's plan.
