10. In the video, what does *segregated* mean? **Segregation means keeping a group of people separate from another group. Sadao Munemori was put in a segregated unit for Nisei, or Japanese-Americans born in the U.S., because they were not trusted then.**
11. Why did Sadao Munemori feel that he had a lot to prove? How did he prove himself?  
**Sample answer: Sadao Munemori felt he had a lot to prove because a strong anti-Japanese sentiment erupted across the country after the attack on Pearl Harbor. Japanese-Americans were not trusted. The United States government assumed their allegiance was to Japan. Sadao Munemori honored his Japanese heritage, but his loyalty was to America because he was born in the United States. Sadao Munemori and many other Japanese-Americans proved themselves through service in the military to show their allegiance to America.**
