

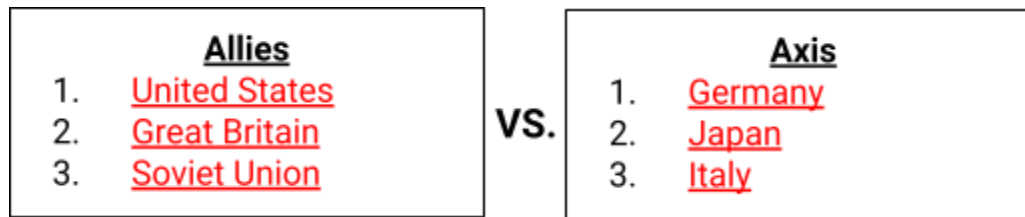

They did so because the church was considered neutral ground, and every human life deserves dignity and compassion, especially when it is suffering.

Their duty was to help anyone wounded who entered the church where they were working, whether they were German or American. They believed that every life was valuable and worth saving, and it was their job to help.
10. Did Wright and Moore decide which soldiers to help based on whether the enemy would help American soldiers in return? Why or why not? Explain your answer.

No, they did not decide which soldiers to help based on whether that country would, in return, help American soldiers. They were uncertain if the enemy would help their country, but they chose not to think about things that way and instead were determined to help anyone who came into the church, no matter what side they were on. They did this because they believed every life was valuable and deserving of compassion.

### Making Connections:

11. In the video, what advice do Wright and Moore give Leo and Layla on the Golden Rule?

Sample answer: Even though the Germans were their enemy, Wright and Moore believed it was important to treat others the way they would like to be treated, even if their enemies wouldn't do the same for them. They explain to Leo and Layla that even though it's not easy, it's called the "Golden Rule" because there is tremendous value in demonstrating a caring attitude toward one another. Doing the right thing doesn't have to start with others showing kindness first.
12. What does Wright and Moore's heroic story teach about the importance of compassion and the Golden Rule? Provide a specific example of how you can apply this lesson to your own life.

Sample answer: Wright and Moore's heroic story taught me the importance of showing compassion and how I should treat people the way I want to be treated. Even if someone is my opponent and is unkind to me, they still deserve dignity if they get injured, make a mistake, or lose the game. I learned I should be compassionate to an opponent simply because they are a person who deserves decency.
