Directions: Answer the following questions using complete sentences.

1. Who helped Moses handle the difficulty of wandering the desert for 40 years?
Sample answer: Moses got a lot of help from God, his family, and the Hebrew people. Even when he didn't want help, deep down, he knew that the work was too much for just one person to handle.
2. After leading the Hebrew people in the desert for so long, why was Moses not allowed to enter the Promised Land? What can we learn from Moses' actions?
Sample answer: Moses disobeyed God by taking matters into his own hands rather than listening to God. God had given Moses specific instructions on how to get water for the people from a rock, but Moses pridefully did it his own way. From Moses' actions, we can learn the importance of following instructions and trusting in God's guidance.
3. Do you think asking for help is a sign of strength or weakness? Explain your answer.
